**ORDER RE: PUBLIC ACCESS TO
HEARING; MEDIA COVERAGE;
BEHAVIOR DURING HEARING**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Television cameras and/or video recording devices will be permitted to film a “set-up shot,” and still camera photographs are allowed in the hearing room, only before the hearing begins. There shall be no use of auxiliary lighting or microphones, no use of the Office of Administrative Hearings’s phone or data lines, and no installation of auxiliary telephone or data lines in connection with such filming and/or photographs.

2. No video and no audio recording devices will be permitted in the hearing room or in the hallway outside of the hearing room during the hearing. Photographs of any type (including, but not limited to, cellular telephone and still camera photographs) shall not be taken in the hearing room or in the hallway outside of the hearing room during the hearing. All hallways outside of the hearing room shall be kept clear of television, video, or audio recording equipment and cables before, during, and after the hearing.

3. Members of the media shall not engage the parties or witnesses in the hearing room or directly outside the hearing room. Access to the hearing room shall not be blocked at any time. There shall be no disruptions to the hearing process.

4. Nothing in this Order prohibits or restricts the presence of the public, including media, from the hearing room during the hearing, subject to any privacy, privilege or confidentiality that has been recognized by the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ). No members of the public may occupy the hallway outside the hearing room during the hearing.

5. Cellular telephones, pagers, and all other noise making devices shall be turned off or to silent mode while the hearing is in session.

6. Members of the media are requested to leave their business cards on the ALJ's bench before the commencement of the hearing.

7. The ALJ retains discretion to modify or rescind this Order as needed.
