State Surplus Property Auction—First of 2016!

Hundreds of items from computers to construction supplies available to the public

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of General Services (DGS) is holding its first Surplus Property Auction of 2016. From construction supplies, video game consoles and building supplies—there's something for everyone.

The DGS Office of Fleet and Asset Management will conduct the auction on Saturday, Feb. 6, at the surplus warehouse at 1700 National Dr. in Sacramento. The media can preview items on Thursday, Feb. 4 between 8 a.m. and 12 p.m.

Items include computers and construction supplies from state agencies, property seized by the California Highway Patrol and those confiscated by the National Transportation Security Administration.

The auction brings in hundreds of thousands of dollars back to the state every year.
