Spring Cleaning Underway at Surplus Property Auction

Hundreds of items from jewelry to knives available to the public

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of General Services (DGS) is doing some spring cleaning. Surplus state property including computers, jewelry and travel gear are among the hundreds of items on auction this quarter.

The DGS Office of Fleet and Asset Management will conduct the auction on Saturday, April 16, at the surplus warehouse at 1700 National Dr. in Sacramento. The media can preview items on Thursday, April 14, from 8 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

Items include printers and tires from state agencies, property seized by the California Highway Patrol and those confiscated by the National Transportation Security Administration.

The auction brings in hundreds of thousands of dollars back to the state every year.
