SACRAMENTO – The California Department of General Services (DGS) is holding its quarterly Surplus Property Auction to gear up for summertime. From bicycles, automotive equipment to designer shoes and handbags – there’s something for everyone.

The DGS Office of Fleet and Asset Management will conduct the auction on Saturday, June 18, at the surplus warehouse at 1700 National Dr. in Sacramento. The media can preview items on Friday, June 17, between 7 and 11 a.m.

Items include computers and office furniture from state agencies, property seized by the California Highway Patrol and those confiscated by the National Transportation Security Administration.

The auction brings in hundreds of thousands of dollars back to the state every year.

Auction and auction preview details include:

- The public can preview items Friday, June 17 from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
- Auction Day, Saturday, June 18. Pre-auction preview 8-9:45 a.m. Auction begins promptly at 10 a.m.
