At hearing in the above consolidated matters, the ALJ requested that Student provide evidence of any Juvenile Court disposition order that issued after the initial hearing date in OAH case number 2010040050. On June 9, 2011, Student filed a copy of a minute order dated January 14, 2011, which provides that, "ORDER of DEJ made on 7/18/10 shall remain in full force and effect" and that "Minor is Released [to] Parent.

The January 14, 2011 Juvenile Court order filed by Student on June 9, 2011, is incomplete, as it incorporates another Order by reference. The exact language of any orders entered, and the date such orders were issued, is critical to determining the issues raised by Student's complaints.

Accordingly, in order to provide the ALJ with the information needed to complete a decision, Student is ordered to file with OAH any Juvenile Court order entered regarding Student after May 20, 2010 (the date of the last minute order offered by Student as evidence) and June 1, 2011 (the date of the hearing on the consolidated matters on remand).

ORDER

1. By the close of business on July 12, 2010, Student shall file with OAH any Juvenile Court order(s) regarding Student entered after May 20, 2010 and before June 1, 2011 (the date of the consolidated hearing on remand). Confidential probation reports are excluded from this Order.

2. Student's counsel shall also file a declaration under penalty of perjury stating that all Juvenile Court orders that comply with this order, and the request made at hearing, have been filed with OAH.

3. Student shall serve the documents referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 above on all other parties to this matter and file a proof of service with OAH.
