What group oils does our base stock go into? Group 2, 3, and 4?

All of our customer products are blended with GII and GIII

• Can our base lubes provide re-refined oil for more than light fleets?

Yes, they can be marketed as re-refined PCMO, HDMO, AFT, UTF, Hydraulic Oils

- Are there CJ 4 re-refined oils available (15 w 40) for low sulfur, low ash diesel engines?
 - o They want to extend their heavy duty oil changes from 6,500 to 12,000 miles and asked about TBN oil sampling in relationship to additive packages (if they have 50% left can go the additional mileage).

Not currently blending re refined CJ-4 oils but we are working with Lubrizol and Infineum (additive companies) to get re refined approvals.

• Are there 10 weight re-refined hydraulic oils available?

Yes 10w is a 110 sus oil and our blenders can offer a ISO 22 hydraulic oil

• Are there 8G CNG compatible re-refined oils available (for CNG vehicles)?

There are no approvals yet but if there was a market we should be able to put some if not all base in to a formula to make it work.

- CalTrans said they have 4 different ISO Grades for specialized equipment and wanted to know if there were re-refined oils available for them
 - o ISO 68 AWWR (Sweeper)
 - o ISO 22 (Calibrated personnel hoist); concerned about dielectric properties and the conduction of electricity

A few of our blenders are ISO 68 approved, and would have to send out a sample for dielectric tests

• Are there cross-contamination issues in mixing re-refined with virgin oils?

No not at all
