Update on the Seismic Mitigation Program

The State Allocation Board's (SAB) Seismic Mitigation Subcommittee and the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) have been working with other involved agencies and stakeholders to develop regulations that will provide greater accessibility to the Seismic Mitigation Program (SMP).

Pursuant to the regulations approved by the SAB on June 22, 2011:

Funding is available for the most vulnerable Category 2 projects that meet the following requirements:

- The construction contract was executed on or after May 20, 2006
- The project funding provided shall be for the minimum work necessary to obtain Division of State Architect (DSA) approval
- The building is designed for occupancy by students and staff
- DSA concurs with the structural engineer's report
- The California Geological Survey concurs with the geologic hazards report, if applicable

Applications for Funding will be funded in date order received.

The SAB directed the regulations to be submitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) on an emergency basis. The regulations will become effective upon approval by the OAL.

To date, four SMP projects have been approved by the SAB. These projects total approximately \$19 million out of the total \$199.5 million set aside by the Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2006 (Proposition 1D) for seismic repair, reconstruction, or replacement of the most vulnerable school facilities.

New Funding Process for School Facility Program

The State Allocation Board (SAB) approved regulations to allow the SAB to provide ongoing monthly priority funding apportionments from cash returning to the School Facility Program (SFP) through rescissions, return of savings, or sources of cash other than bond sales at the May 25, 2011 meeting.

In order to accomplish this, the regulations create two certification filing periods per year in order for all projects on the Unfunded Approvals list to receive apportionments. Each period will have a 30-day certification submittal window. The certification will be valid for six months beginning the second Wednesday in January and the second Wednesday in July each year. As bond sales take place or cash becomes available, districts that have submitted a certification within the appropriate six-month window will be eligible for priority funding apportionments.

If the district's project receives an apportionment, the district will have 90 days to submit a *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05).

- Information concerning priority funding filing periods will be posted on the OPSC website.
- Email notifications will be sent to all districts providing information on upcoming priority funding certification periods.
- Additionally, districts will be notified by mail during the 90-day filing period.

Projects that fail to meet this deadline will be rescinded with no further Board action. For purposes of priority funding, a rescinded application will be placed back on the Unfunded Approvals List with an Unfunded Approval date that is the date the Form SAB 50-05 was due.

Districts may request an apportionment for Design Only applications under the priority funding round. Design Only applications receiving an apportionment will receive an automatic fund release without submitting a Form SAB 50-05. However, Design Only applications must still submit a request to convert an Unfunded Approval to an Apportionment.

Currently, the regulations are in the review process. Once approved by the Office of Administrative Law, school districts will have 30 calendar days to submit certifications for the first filing round.

- Districts that have approved applications on the Unfunded List may be granted an apportionment if the district certifies that it will submit a request for fund release within 90 days of the apportionment date.
- All certifications must be submitted to the following address:
 - Office of Public School Construction
 - Subject: Priority Funding Round
 - 707 3rd Street
 - West Sacramento, California 95605
- Certifications must be physically received by the OPSC on or before the due date.
- The certifications will be valid until January 10, 2012.

It is important that all school districts that can meet the certification submit the certifications within the filing periods, no matter the location of the project on the Unfunded Approvals list. The listing of school districts ready for apportionments will be provided to the State Treasurer’s Office and the Department of Finance for determining the cash needs of the SFP.

The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) Outreach Team was officially introduced at the April 25, 2011 State Allocation Board (SAB) meeting. This new team was created to help districts understand and access the programs offered by the SAB through the OPSC. The Outreach Team is available to evaluate districts' needs and goals and match them with eligible programs. The Outreach Team can provide program options that align with a district's facility needs and offer guidance through the program application process.

Since the largest amount of remaining bond authority at this time is available in the School Facility Program Modernization Program, the Outreach Team's current focus is to help districts access this program by evaluating their schools' modernization needs. The team is available to provide one-on-one assistance in establishing or updating modernization eligibility for school sites and to guide districts through the modernization funding application process.

In addition to the one-on-one services, there are additional resources available to districts on the OPSC website, including [webinars](#) that guide districts through the process with step-by-step tutorials and specific program requirements. This allows districts to access resources and information at their own convenience.

Financial Hardship Re-Reviews

On May 25, 2011, the State Allocation Board (SAB) took action to allow School Facility Program (SFP) [Regulation Section 1859.81\(f\)](#) to sunset. This means that Financial Hardship projects currently on the unfunded list will now undergo a review of their financial records to determine if they have any additional funds available to contribute to their project(s) prior to receiving an actual apportionment. For projects added to an unfunded list between February 25, 2009 and June 30, 2011, only the district's revenue received on or after July 1, 2011 will be considered in the calculations of available funds. Projects added to an unfunded list after July 1, 2011 will be subject to a review of additional funds available, as described in SFP [Regulation Section 1859.81\(e\)](#).

The Board also established two 30-day "priority in funding" rounds each year beginning on the second Wednesday of January and the second Wednesday of July. Financial Hardship districts with projects on an unfunded list that wish to participate in a funding round will be contacted by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) for documentation necessary to conduct a review to determine if additional funds are available to contribute to their project(s). The district will be sent a contact letter informing them that this review will have to be conducted prior to the district receiving an apportionment. Along with the letter, a checklist of the required documentation and fund worksheets (that must be filled out by the district) will be provided. Returning the requested documentation along with completed fund worksheets will help the OPSC expedite the re-review for the district. Any incomplete packages will be returned to the district unprocessed. These reviews must be completed prior to the district receiving an actual apportionment.

Additional Grant for Site Development

At the July 12, 2011 meeting, the State Allocation Board (SAB) adopted an amendment to the School Facility Program (SFP) Regulations to extend the expiration date of the additional grant for general site development by two years, to January 1, 2014, and authorized the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) to file the proposed regulations with the Office of Administrative Law.

These regulations were originally created in response to grant adequacy discussions in 2006, in which a preliminary analysis conducted by the Grant Adequacy Ad Hoc Committee concluded that a supplemental grant for General Site Development may not have been considered in the per-pupil grant in Chapter 407, Statutes of 1998 (SB 50 - Greene). In December 2007, the SAB approved regulations to provide an additional grant for General Site Development for new construction projects that are new schools or additions to existing sites where additional acreage is being acquired.

The regulations implementing this additional grant were effective beginning September 5, 2006 with a suspension date of "no later than January 1, 2008," but the SAB has approved extensions to continue providing the grant.

Bond Proceeds Released

The Office of Public School Construction has processed the following fund releases from 2009 and 2010 bond sales as of July 8, 2011:

March 2009 Bond Sale:

Total funds released: \$528.8 million of \$528.8 million — 100 percent
Total projects: 235 projects have received funds

April 2009 Bond Sale:

Total funds released: \$1.398 billion of \$1.438 billion — 97 percent
Total projects: 404 projects have received funds

October 2009 Bond Sale and November 2009 Commercial Paper:

Total funds released: \$464.3 million of \$509.6 million — 91 percent
Total projects: 225 projects have received funds

November 2009 Bond Sale and December 2009 Commercial Paper:

Total funds released: \$103.3 million of \$111.4 million — 93 percent
Total projects: 34 projects have received funds

March 2010 Bond Sale:

Total funds released: \$1,191.9 million of \$1,351.4 million — 88 percent
Total projects: 258 projects have received funds

November 2010 Bond Sale:

Total funds released: \$1,426.8 million of \$1,483.1 million — 96 percent
Total projects: 502 projects have received funds



Regulatory Update

Two-Year Extension of the General Site Development Additional Grant

- Extends the additional grant until no later than January 1, 2014.
- Amends Regulation Section 1859.76.
- Administrative review has begun.

Seismic Mitigation Program Regulatory Amendments

- EMERGENCY STATUS
- Helps broaden participation in the Seismic Mitigation Program (SMP) to facilitate apportioning the remaining \$194.8 million in SMP funding to eligible projects. Increases the number of eligible building structure types from eight to 14 and eliminates the 1.68g ground-shaking threshold. Clarifies criteria that structures must have "structural deficiencies that post an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in a seismic event."
- Amends Regulation Sections 1859.2 and 1859.82.
- Administrative review continues.

Priorities in Funding Process

Resumption of Financial Hardship Re-Reviews

- EMERGENCY STATUS
- 1) Priority funding "rounds" changed to "process." Application periods will begin on July 13, 2011 or as soon thereafter as the regulations become effective, and annually on second Wednesday of January and July.
- 2) Sets forth criteria for financial hardship re-reviews to resume on or after July 1, 2011.
- Amends Sections 1859.90.2 and 1859.81.
- Administrative review continues.

One-Year Extension of State Allocation Board (SAB) Authority to Continue Inactive Preliminary Charter School Apportionments

- Extends the SAB's authority until July 1, 2012.
- Amends Regulation Section 1859.166.2.
- Administrative review continues.
- Public comment period ends 09/05/11.

Note: Regulations become effective upon review and approval of the Office of Administrative Law.
