DESCRIPTION OF PRIORITIES

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## PRIORITY 1

Projects for districts which have met the following tests for reducing the cost to the State of the school construction program.

1. The district has
    - a. accepted a reduction in eligibility for State funding for new schools, or
    - b. placed a specified percentage of students on a multi-track year-round school schedule, or
    - c. received a waiver from those requirements.
  2. The district is contributing at least 50% of the total project cost from local funding sources.
  3. The district has agreed to increase by 20% the number of students which will be housed in the new school.
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## PRIORITY 2

Projects for districts which have met the following tests for reducing the cost to the State of the school construction program.

1. The district has
    - a. accepted a reduction in eligibility for State funding for new schools, or
    - b. placed a specified percentage of students on a multi-track year-round school schedule, or
    - c. received a waiver from those requirements.
  2. No requirement for the district to contribute 50% of the total project cost from local funding sources.
  3. The district has agreed to increase by 20% the number of students which will be housed in the new school.
