**1. SCOPE**

The State's contract with Granite Construction provides Asphalt Concrete, Plant Mix, Delivered at contracted pricing to the State of California Department of Transportation (DOT) in accordance with the requirements of Contract # 1-09-56-20-09A. The contractor shall supply the entire portfolio of products as identified in the contract and will be the primary point of contact for data collection, reporting, and distribution of Asphalt Concrete, Plant Mix, Delivered to the State.

The contract term is for two (2) years with an option to extend the contract for one (1) additional one (1) year period or portion thereof. The terms, conditions, and prices for the contract extension option shall be by mutual agreement between the contractor and the State. If a mutual agreement cannot be met the contract may be terminated at the end of the current contract term.

**2. CONTRACT USAGE/RULES**

- A. The use of this contract is non-mandatory for the Department of Transportation. Local governmental agencies are not eligible to utilize the contract.
- B. DOT must adhere to all applicable State laws, regulations, policies, best practices, and purchasing authority requirements, e.g. California Codes, Code of Regulations, State Administrative Manual, Management Memos, and State Contract Manual Volume 2 and 3, as applicable.
- C. Prior to placing orders against this contract, DOT must have been granted purchasing authority by the Department of General Services, Procurement Division (DGS/PD) for the use of the State's statewide contracts. The department's current purchasing authority number must be entered in the appropriate location on each purchase document. ## 6. PROBLEM RESOLUTION/SUPPLIER PERFORMANCE

DOT and/or contractors shall inform the State Contract Administrator of any technical or contractual difficulties encountered during contract performance in a timely manner. This includes and is not limited to informal disputes, supplier performance, outstanding deliveries, etc.

### PRICE ESCALATION:

#### Material Costs:

The contractor may submit a request for price increase, in writing, to the State Contract Administrator no earlier than 60 days from the effective date of the contract.

1. Requests for price increases shall include substantiated information to support the proposed escalation (e.g., manufacturer's price list, significant changes in published market indicators for the industry, certified raw material cost data and any other substantiating information as requested by the State).
2. Upon receipt of such notice, the State reserves the right to either:
  - a. Accept the escalation as competitive with the general market price at that time; effective 30 days from receipt of an acceptable notice; or
  - b. Negotiate proposed price escalation. Note: The State will notify, in writing, the contractor of its desire to negotiate. The State will have ten (10) working days to complete negotiations; or
  - c. Cancel any unpurchased balance of the contract without prejudice, effective upon written notice from the State.

Note: If negotiations fail to produce any agreement, the State reserves the right to exercise Options 2.a or 2.c with an effective date no later than ten (10) working days after the unsuccessful negotiation.

3. No price increase shall apply to quantities ordered from the contract prior to the effective date of the price increase.
4. Accepted escalation price increase shall be firm for a minimum period of 60 days from the effective date of the approved price increase. Any additional requests for price increases must be submitted, in writing, to the State Contract Administrator no earlier than 60 calendar days from the effective date of the original or prior price increase approval.

Fuel Costs:

1. The contractor may submit a proposed escalation for delivery cost, in writing, to Procurement Division when the cost of fuel has increased no less than ten percent from the original fuel cost. Such notice shall include substantiated information to support the proposed escalation from the published OPIS (Oil Price Information Service) the market indicator for the fuel industry. The Department of General Services, Procurement Division tracks and monitors such fuel changes. Procurement Division publishes the weekly fuel rate changes. The fuel rates can be accessed and viewed on Procurement Division's web site at ([www.pd.dgs.ca.gov/contracts/fuelrates](http://www.pd.dgs.ca.gov/contracts/fuelrates)).
2. Upon receipt of such notice the State reserves the right to either:
  - a. Accept the escalation as competitive with the general market price at that time, effective 30 days from receipt of an acceptance notice; or
  - b. Negotiate a proposed price escalation; Note: The State will notify, in writing, the contractor of its desire to negotiate. The State will have ten (10) working days to complete negotiations; or
  - c. Cancel any unpurchased balance of the contract without prejudice, effective upon written notice from the State.
3. No price increase shall apply to quantities ordered from the contract prior to the effective date of the price increase.
4. Accepted escalation price increase shall be firm for a minimum period of 60 days from the effective date of the approved price increase. Any additional requests for price increases must be submitted, in writing, to the State Contract Administrator no earlier than 60 calendar days from the effective date of the original or prior price increase approval.

Price Declines:

The Contractor shall immediately notify the State Contract Administrator for all manufacturers' price declines and the state shall receive full benefit of such declines, effective on the date of manufacturer's public announcement.

**9. SPECIFICATIONS**

All products delivered against any contract resulting from this bid MUST comply with the applicable Department of Transportation, Standard Specifications, latest edition, Sections 39, 92, and 93. Products delivered must comply with minimum paving temperature of asphalt concrete per specification Section 39.

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**REGULAR DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS**

The State shall place orders with the contractor at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the requested delivery date and time.

Department of Transportation will determine and notify the contractor of the expected arrival time at the job site, the number of trucks and rounds required per truck or time intervals and quantity at time of order.

The Contractor agrees to deliver during the operating hours of 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday except State observed holidays.

Contractor is requested to make deliveries in Los Angeles County, Orange County, San Bernardino Metropolitan Area, and San Diego Metropolitan Area during off-peak hours. Off-peak hours are Monday through Friday, 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

Note: In accordance with paragraph 15 of the General Provisions entitled "Delivery", the contractor shall strictly adhere to the delivery terms and completion schedule as specified in this bid. Failure to comply with the delivery requirements, as stated, may be considered a breach of contract and subject the contractor to General Provisions 26, entitled "Rights and Remedies of the State for Default."

**STANDING TIME**

The State shall be entitled to standing time for the purpose of unloading (connected to the paving equipment) of not more than one half hour free of any charges to the State. The State shall be entitled to forty five (45) minutes standing time for Transfer Truck deliveries.

The Standing time shall begin when the carrier is ready to transfer to the paving equipment or ready to dump (excluding preparation time removing tarp, etc.), but not earlier than the requested time of arrival.

End time shall conclude when the carrier disconnects from the paving equipment or has finished delivery of the product.

The contractor may assess a charge of \$1.25 per minute for time in which the carrier's equipment is detained through no fault of the carrier, in excess of the one half hour unloading time and (45) minutes for Transfer Trucks. The contractor shall provide appropriate documentation that supports the assessment. For payment to be processed, a separate assessment invoice must accompany the material invoice.

**DELAYED DELIVERY DAMAGES CASUED BY THE CONTRACTOR**

In the event the material on this contract is delayed, or not in accordance with the contract specifications, through no fault of the State, the contractor will be liable for direct manpower and/or idle equipment costs incurred by the State. The Department of Transportation shall calculate such charges using the IMMS (Integrated Maintenance Management System). The IMMS system is designed to track maintenance activities and expenditures. The State shall provide the contractor documentation of State incurred costs and deduct cost from the contractors' invoice.

**DELAYED DELIVERY DAMAGES CAUSED BY THE STATE**

In the event delivery of material on this contract is delayed, through no fault of the contractor, and less than a twenty-four hour notice of change has been given to the contractor, the State will compensate the contractor. Compensation for delay of delivery shall be at a rate of \$1.25 per minute from the original scheduled start time to the new scheduled start time plus the cost of material.

Example: Original scheduled start time 10:00 a.m. ----- new scheduled start time 11:30 a.m.

**Compensation Calculation: 90 minutes x \$1.25 = \$112.50 + cost of material**

**CANCELLATION OF DELIVERY DAMAGES CAUSED BY THE STATE**

In the event delivery of the ordered material on this contract is cancelled, through no fault of the contractor, the State will compensate the contractor. Compensation shall be as follows:

1. Cancellation of ordered delivery with less than twenty-four hours and more than twelve hours notice to the contractor, the State shall compensate the contractor at a rate of ten percent (10%) of the purchase order value.

Example: Purchase order issued for 500 tons of 1/2" – PG 64-16 to be delivered in a belly dump at a cost of \$ 81.50 per ton

Compensation Calculation:

500 (tons) X \$ 81.50 = \$ 40,750.00 X 10% = \$ 4,075.00

Contractor shall provide documentation to the State and invoice accordingly.

2. Cancellation of ordered delivery with less than twelve hours notice to the contractor, the State shall compensate the Contractor at a rate of twenty percent (20%) of the purchase order value.

Example: Purchase order issued for 500 tons of 1/2" – PG 64-16 to be delivered in a belly dump at a cost of \$ 81.50 per ton

Compensation Calculation:

$$500 \text{ (tons)} \times \$ 81.50 = \$ 40,750.00 \times 20\% = \$ 8,150.00$$

Contractor shall provide documentation to the State and invoice accordingly.

**MODIFICATION OF CONTRACT**

Delivery sites may be changed, deleted or added as deemed necessary by the Department of General Services, Procurement Division.

Any contract resulting from this bid may be modified in whole or in part upon mutual agreement of both parties. Such modifications shall be in writing, signed and dated by authorized representatives of each party.
