**1 SCOPE**

This document establishes the requirements for vital sign monitor and mobilized stand used in 33 California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) institutions.

**2 APPLICABLE SPECIFICATIONS / STANDARDS / CODES**

Specifications, standards and codes referenced in this document in effect on the opening of the 'Invitation For Bid', form a part of this specification.

**3 REQUIREMENTS**

3.1 Vital sign monitor shall:

3.1.1 Be capable of measuring noninvasive blood pressure, pulse rate and temperature for supporting adult and pediatric patients in the ranges listed in the table.

- 3.1.2 Have either LED or LCD type of monitor to display measured parameters, including but not limited to, Systolic, Diastolic, Mean Arterial Pressure (MAP), Pulse Rate and Temperature.
- 3.1.3 Be equipped with reusable pressure cuffs with three adult sizes (Large, Medium and Small).
- 3.1.4 Have automatic noninvasive blood pressure monitoring mode.
- 3.1.5 Shall meet or exceed standard AP10:2002 AAMI in blood pressure accuracy measurement.
- 3.1.6 Have pressure and temperature determination times less than or equal to 45 seconds.
- 3.1.7 Be capable of probing at sites: oral, rectal and axillary.
- 3.1.8 Be equipped with a temperature probe-cover box holder.
- 3.1.9 Be powered by rechargeable batteries and AC power source at 120VAC +/- 10%, 50/60 Hz.
- 3.1.10 Have operational time minimum of 4 hours for each single charge of battery.
- 3.1.11 Have operating temperature range between +10C to +40C.

- 3.1.12 Be equipped with programmable patient alarms to monitor, including but not limited to, noninvasive blood pressure and pulse rate.
  - 3.1.13 Have memory to store measurement data for a minimum of 24 hours.
  - 3.1.14 Be capable of connecting to other instruments via either RS232 or Ethernet.
  - 3.1.15 Have maximum weight of 7 pounds and dimensions smaller than 11"(W) x 7" (D) x 9" (H).
  - 3.1.16 Be pole mounted on a mobile stand specified in section 3.2.
- 3.2 Mobile stand shall:
- 3.2.1 Have durable metallic pole capable of supporting the weight of the vital sign monitor securely mounted on the top.
  - 3.2.2 Have minimum pole height of 35" from floor to monitor mounting plate.
  - 3.2.3 Be mobilized on a set of 4 or 5 caster wheels.
  - 3.2.4 Have accessory basket hanging on the pole.

# CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATIONS

## SPECIAL PROVISIONS

### CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS SPECIAL PROVISIONS

#### Digest of Laws

By signing this contract, the Contractor agrees that, if the provisions of the contract require the contractor to enter an institution, the Contractor and his/her employees shall be aware of and abide by the following rules:

#### DIGEST OF LAWS RELATED TO ASSOCIATION WITH PRISON INMATES

Individuals who are not employees of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitations (CDCR), but who are working in and around inmates who are incarcerated within California's institutions/facilities or camps, are to be apprised of the laws, rules and regulations governing conduct in associating with prison inmates. The following is a summation of pertinent information when non-departmental employees come in contact with prison inmates.

- a. Persons who are not employed by CDCR, but are engaged in work at any institution/facility or camp must observe and abide by all laws, rules and regulations governing the conduct of their behavior in associating with prison inmates. Failure to comply with these guidelines may lead to expulsion from CDCR institutions/facilities or camps.

- b. CDCR does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CDCR has a "NO HOSTAGE" policy and all prison inmates, visitors, and employees shall be made aware of this.

- c. All persons entering onto institution/facility or campgrounds consent to a search of their person, property or vehicle at any time. Refusal by individuals to submit to a search of their person, property or vehicle may be cause for denial of access to the premises.

- d. Persons normally permitted to enter an institution/facility or camp may be barred, for cause, by the CDCR Director, Warden and/or Regional Parole Administrator.

- e. It is illegal for an individual who has been previously convicted of a felony offense to enter into CDCR institutions/facilities or camps without the prior approval of the Warden. It is also illegal for an individual to enter onto these premises for unauthorized purposes or to refuse to leave said premises when requested to do so. Failure to comply with this provision could lead to prosecution.

- f. Encouraging and/or assisting prison inmates to escape is a crime. It is illegal to bring firearms, deadly weapons, explosives, tear gas, drugs or drug paraphernalia on CDCR institutions/facilities or camp premises. It is illegal to give prison inmates firearms, explosives, alcoholic beverages, narcotics, or any drug or drug paraphernalia, including cocaine or marijuana.

- g. It is illegal to give or take letters from prison inmates without the authorization of the Warden. It is also illegal to give or receive any type of gift and/or gratuities from prison inmates.

- h. In an emergency situation, the visiting program and other program activities may be suspended.

- i. For security reasons, visitors must not wear clothing that in any way resembles state issued prison inmate clothing (blue denim shirts, blue denim pants).

- j. Interviews with SPECIFIC INMATES are not permitted. Conspiring with an inmate to circumvent policy and/or regulations constitutes a rule violation that may result in appropriate legal action.

### ASSEMBLY BILL 384 -- TOBACCO USE PROHIBITION

Assembly Bill (AB) 384 was signed into law by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and takes effect on July 1, 2005. As you may know, AB 384 bans the use of tobacco products (i.e., cigarettes, cigars, snuff, and chewing tobacco) by all staff, visitors, inmates, and all persons on the grounds of any institution. The only time tobacco use is permitted is during Department approved religious ceremonies and in residential staff housing where inmates are not present.

The importance of AB 384 is to promote a more healthful and productive work environment for employees and to reduce tobacco-related health care costs for inmates. At the same time, it is recognized that this will pose a considerable challenge for those who smoke or use other tobacco products. Accordingly, resources are provided below for staff to pursue while off duty if they choose to quit using tobacco products.
