SCOPE OF WORK (DENTAL OPERATORY SYSTEM)

SCOPE

This Scope of Work (SOW) provides agreement details for equipment delivery, initial assembly and set-in-place; make equipment operational, acceptance and training requirements between the Contractor and the California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation (CDCR) at designated CDCR institutions in accordance with the attached delivery schedule.

PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Each institution's Chief Dentist or designee shall act as project manager. Any delivery and acceptance scheduling, including assembly and set-up, and/or training shall be communicated by the Contractor to the Project Manager in writing.

CONTRACTOR TASKS/RESPONSIBILITIES/DELIVERABLES

Contractor is not responsible for the removal of dated and/or end-of-life equipment from the installation site. Contractor shall schedule delivery on a mutually agreed upon date, time and place. Contractor shall assemble the equipment, set-in-place and make operational in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and/or specifications. Equipment deliveries shall be completed within six (6) months of award of the contract or on a mutually agreed upon date and time.

On the delivery date and after acceptance by the State, the contractor shall provide training at each receiving institution on the software and equipment. Training shall include demonstrations and hands-on operation and use of the software and equipment by dental staff. Contractor shall provide manufacturer's literature and/or brochures and/or training materials as educational aids for dental staff. All literature and/or brochures and/or training materials shall be in the English language. Training shall be one hour in duration and shall be scheduled when staff is available. Training shall be scheduled not less than 90 minutes prior to close of business or shift change to allow staff sufficient time to receive comprehensive instruction.

Contractor shall respond to service requests during normal work hours of 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM, (Mon-Fri), except State holidays.

SITE REQUIREMENTS:

The Vendor/Delivery driver MUST comply with each Institution's delivery site requirements. See attached copy of the Digest of Laws for details. Vendor is responsible for obtaining required supplier staff security clearances in advance of

each visit, service call or delivery, as specified (by each delivery-site requirement), in Title 15, Sec. 3173, Chapter B.

SMOKING BAN:

A Smoking Ban, AB 384, bans the use of tobacco products (i.e., cigarettes, cigars, snuff, and chewing tobacco) by all staff, visitors, inmates, and all persons on the grounds of any institution. See attached.

PRODUCT INFORMATION:

The name of the manufacturer, brand or trade name of the item that the vendor proposes must be furnished along with any manufacturer's product literature and/or manufacturer's product manual. Failure to provide this information may cause the bid to be disqualified.

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Digest of Laws

By signing this contract, the Contractor agrees that, if the provisions of the contract require the contractor to enter an institution, the Contractor and his/her employees shall be aware of and abide by the following rules:

DIGEST OF LAWS RELATED TO ASSOCIATION WITH PRISON INMATES

Individuals who are not employees of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitations (CDCR), but who are working in and around inmates who are incarcerated within California's institutions/facilities or camps, are to be apprised of the laws, rules and regulations governing conduct in associating with prison inmates. The following is a summation of pertinent information when non-departmental employees come in contact with prison inmates.

- a. Persons who are not employed, by CDCR, but are engaged in work at any institution/facility or camp must observe and abide by all laws, rules and regulations governing the conduct of their behavior in associating with prison inmates. Failure to comply with these guidelines may lead to expulsion from CDCR institutions/facilities or camps.

- b. CDCR does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CDCR has a "NO HOSTAGE" policy and all prison inmates, visitors, and employees shall be made aware of this.

- c. All persons entering onto institution/facility or campgrounds consent to a search of their person, property or vehicle at any time. Refusal by individuals to submit to a search of their person, property or vehicle may be cause for denial of access to the premises.

- d. Persons normally permitted to enter an institution/facility or camp may be barred, for cause, by the CDCR Director, Warden and /or Regional Parole Administrator.

- e. It is illegal for an individual who has been previously convicted of a felony offense to enter into CDCR institutions/facilities or camps without the prior approval of the Warden. It is also illegal for an individual to enter onto these premises for unauthorized purposes or to refuse to leave said premises when requested to do so. Failure to comply with this provision could lead to prosecution.

- f. Encouraging and/or assisting prison inmates to escape is a crime. It is illegal to bring firearms, deadly weapons, explosives, tear gas, drugs or drug paraphernalia on CDCR institutions/facilities or camp premises. It is illegal to give prison inmates firearms, explosives, alcoholic beverages, narcotics, or any drug or drug paraphernalia, including cocaine or marijuana.

- g. It is illegal to give or take letters from prison inmates without the authorization of the Warden. It is also illegal to give or receive any type of gift and/or gratuities from prison inmates.

- h. In an emergency situation, the visiting program and other program activities may be suspended.

- i. For security reasons, visitors must not wear clothing that in any way resembles state issued prison inmate clothing (blue denim shirts, blue denim pants).

- j. Interviews with SPECIFIC INMATES are not permitted. Conspiring with an inmate to circumvent policy and/or regulations constitutes a rule violation that may result in appropriate legal action.

ASSEMBLY BILL 384 -- TOBACCO USE PROHIBITION

Assembly Bill (AB) 384 was signed into law by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and takes effect on July 1, 2005. As you may know, AB 384 bans the use of tobacco products (i.e., cigarettes, cigars, snuff, and chewing tobacco) by all staff, visitors, inmates, and all persons on the grounds of any institution. The only time tobacco use is permitted is during Department approved religious ceremonies and in residential staff housing where inmates are not present.

The importance of AB 384 is to promote a more healthful and productive work environment for employees and to reduce tobacco-related health care costs for inmates. At the same time, it is recognized that this will pose a considerable challenge for those who smoke or use other tobacco products. Accordingly, resources are provided below for staff to pursue while off duty if they choose to quit using tobacco products:
