The State of California invites your organization to become a “Reciprocity Partner” and accept the State’s certification for small businesses (SB), microbusinesses (MB) and Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBE) .

The State of California maintains a full-time staff of analysts who qualify and certify these firms according to standards set out in State law and regulation.

WHY IS THE STATE WILLING TO TAKE ON STATEWIDE CERTIFICATION?

The State is required by law to be the single certifying entity for State certification; we encourage local governments to use our services.

When you become a Reciprocity Partner, the responsibility for certification is transferred from your organization to the State of California. We are willing to take on this additional responsibility for local governments, community colleges, and school districts because we believe a streamlined certification process increases the statewide pool of eligible businesses.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Maintain high quality certification standards statewide
- Reduce administrative costs for partnering organizations
- Minimize repetitive certification requirements for SBs and DVBEs

PARTNER BENEFITS

- Reduce the administrative cost of maintaining your own certification program.
- Access the State’s easy-to-use, online database of certified firms to check certification status or search for qualified firms.
- Build your local economy. Local firms who become State certified increase their exposure to State contracting officials and other local governments, community colleges, and school districts and can access additional contracting opportunities.

SMALL BUSINESS/DVBE BENEFITS

- Businesses complete only one application.
- Businesses register online to receive automatic notification of bidding opportunities.
- Increased visibility. Certified firms are automatically entered into an online, statewide database.
- The State may give a 5% bid preference to SBs.
- The State may offer up to a 5% bid incentive to DVBEs.
