EXECUTIVE ORDER D-19-83

Whereas, Senator Alfred E. Alquist was first elected to the California State Assembly in 1962 and to the State Senate in 1966 and is now in his 21st year of service as a legislator for the people of Santa Clara County, and

Whereas, Senator Alquist has provided outstanding leadership and made a substantial contribution in public service to the people of the City of San Jose, the County of Santa Clara, and the State of California; and

Whereas, since 1945 Santa Clara County legislators have attempted to secure approval for the siting of a State Office Building in the City of San Jose; and

Whereas, completion of the San Jose State Building marks the culmination of Senator Alquist's twenty-year effort towards gaining legislative approval and funding for the State Building; and

Whereas, the completion and dedication of the State Building on Paseo De San Antonio serves as an anchor and stimulus to San Jose's continuing downtown renaissance and economic vitality; and

Whereas, it is now fitting and proper that this building be dedicated to and bear the name of its special patron, Senator Alfred E. Alquist.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE DEUKMEJIAN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby order that the State Building in San Jose be designated and be hereafter known as the Alfred E. Alquist Building, and that the Department of General Services shall erect appropriate signs at the State Office Building and shall cause all directories and publications concerning the State Office Building to reflect such designation.
