EXECUTIVE ORDER D-28-83

WHEREAS, the State of California is the owner of real property throughout the state which is no longer required for state functions; and

WHEREAS, those properties surplus to state needs should be sold, generating revenue to the State and returning the unused properties to the local tax rolls;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE DEUKMEJIAN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby issue this order to become effective immediately:

1. All directors of state agencies holding real property are directed to cooperate with the Department of General Services' Office of Real Estate Services in implementing a surplus real property identification program;
2. All directors of state agencies holding real property are to actively participate with the Office of Real Estate Services in reviewing those properties under their jurisdiction to identify the following:
 - a) Properties which are effectively utilized for state agency programs;
 - b) Properties which could be better utilized for joint state agency use, joint state and local government uses, or program needs of other state agencies;
 - c) Properties which are not required for state governmental programs and should be declared surplus and sold;
3. In the event of a disagreement between a state agency and the Director of General Services, the Director of Finance is hereby directed to make a final determination as to whether a parcel of real property should be declared surplus.
