EXECUTIVE ORDER D-50-86

WHEREAS, the State spends more than \$300 million annually for energy at State-funded institutions; and

WHEREAS, increased energy costs have taken a greater percentage of the State facilities' operating budget, reducing funds available for essential services; and

WHEREAS, proven cost saving measures are available to significantly reduce these costs; and

WHEREAS, sound business practice requires accountability for controlling expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the energy infrastructure at State-owned facilities is in need of repair;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE DEUKMEJIAN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby issue this order to become effective immediately:

1. The following goals for State facilities are hereby established;
 - (a) Reduce energy use (adjusted for varying levels of service) by 15% for fiscal year 1989/90 and 25% for Fiscal Year 1992/93 as compared to Fiscal Year 1979/80;
 - (b) Increase the efficiency and use of available energy resources at State facilities without endangering public health and safety;
 - (c) Provide adequate and reliable energy infrastructure at all major State institutions by FY 1992/93;
 - (d) Increase the use of public/private arrangements for providing the necessary infrastructure improvements.
2. All State agencies responsible for State facilities shall:
 - (a) Monitor monthly facility energy use and report on a quarterly basis to the Department of General Services' Office of Energy Assessments;
 - (b) Develop, implement, and update annually an agency-wide five-year Energy Management Plan including a standardized facility auditing program;
 - (c) Designate energy managers responsible for carrying out the Energy Management Plan at all State facilities.

3. The Department of Finance and the Department of General Services, in cooperation with the California Energy Commission, shall develop the procedures and standard practices necessary to carry out these goals and actions.
4. The following agencies are encouraged to comply with this Order to the greatest extent possible:

Board of Governor's, Community Colleges
Regents of the University of California
Trustees of the California State University
5. State-leased facilities are to comply with this Order to the greatest extent possible, subject to the individual terms and conditions of the lease.
6. The California Public Utilities Commission and the California Energy Commission are requested to support this Order where possible.
7. This Executive Order supersedes Executive Order 78-81.
