EXECUTIVE ORDER D-66-87

WHEREAS, Jesse Marvin Unruh was the architect of the modern California Legislature, serving as Speaker of the Assembly for seven years during the time he was a member from 1955 until 1970, and

WHEREAS, he wielded tremendous influence in waging an unrelenting battle against poverty, violence, and the injustice of discrimination, at the same time upholding the rights of consumers, protecting California's treasured natural resources, and improving the educational instruction of our young people; and

WHEREAS, he served with distinction as Treasurer of the State of California from 1974 until his death in 1987, successfully investing and safeguarding billions of dollars in financial holdings belonging to the people of our state; and

WHEREAS, Jesse Unruh devoted much of his life to service on behalf of the people of California, becoming one of our most loyal and distinguished public officials; and

WHEREAS, the people of California, who now mourn his passing, will always recall his contributions with deep gratitude;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE DEUKMEJIAN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby issue this order to become effective immediately:

1. State Office Building #1 shall be named the Jesse Unruh Office Building in appreciation of his tireless service and devotion.
