EXECUTIVE ORDER D-68-87

WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan provided strong leadership for the people of California during the eight years in which he served as Governor of California; and

WHEREAS, during his two terms in office, Governor Reagan was successful in implementing major initiatives in welfare reform, tax relief, regulatory reform, job creation, fiscal stability, public safety, education, transportation and protection of the state's treasured natural resources; and

WHEREAS, in 1980 Ronald Reagan was elected to the Presidency of the United States, and in 1984 was reelected by an overwhelming majority of American Voters; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan has served our nation with great distinction, providing vision and leadership that has again turned America into a nation that is strong, prosperous and committed to opportunity for all residents; and

WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan is the only California governor to have served as President of the United States; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan has devoted much of his life to service on behalf of the people of California and America, becoming one of our most respected and loyal public servants;

NOW, THEREFORE, I GEORGE DEUKMEJIAN, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby declare that the new State Office Building to be constructed at 3rd and 4th Streets, between Spring and Main Streets in Los Angeles, shall be officially named the Ronald Reagan Building.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of California to be affixed this 31st day of December 1987.
