EXECUTIVE ORDER W-8-91

WHEREAS, Executive Order D-90-90, issued on November 19, 1990, prohibited the hiring of new General Fund state employees; and

WHEREAS, the State and national economies continue to experience a significant slow down, and as a result, the State continues to experience a significant decline in revenue; and

WHEREAS, State expenditures for the 1990-91 fiscal year are expected to be higher than budgeted;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, PETE WILSON, Governor of the State of California, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and statutes of the State of California, do hereby issue this order to become effective immediately:

1. All State agencies and departments regardless of funding source are prohibited from filling vacancies that would constitute a new hire to state government.
2. The provisions of this Executive Order shall not apply to the Legislative and Judicial branches of government. However, I invite these branches of government to participate.
3. The University of California and the California State Universities are requested to comply with the provisions of this Executive Order.
4. The Department of Finance and the Department of Personnel Administration are hereby directed to coordinate the implementation of this Executive Order. A Management Memo addressing implementation procedures will be issued within 5 days.
5. The provisions of this Executive Order will terminate on July 1, 1991.
