## **State Your Mode 2009 State Employee Commute Survey**

During the summer of 2009, the Department of General Services (DGS) conducted a transportation survey of State employees working in the Sacramento region. The purpose of this survey was to collect information on commute choices and patterns for research for the department's regional strategic facilities planning efforts. Additionally, the data can be used by individual State agencies interested in developing transportation management strategies at specific locations. As the largest employer in the region, State employee commute statistics also inform local and regional planning activities.

The DGS conducted the last comprehensive commute survey of State employees in June of 2001, targeting those working in the City of Sacramento core area. For State Your Mode 2009, the survey area was expanded to include State agencies and departments located throughout Sacramento County and the City of West Sacramento; 142 agencies/departments were identified employing approximately 68,000 potential respondents. Approximately 13,800 employees responded for a response rate of 20 percent.

The State Your Mode 2001 Survey results serve as a baseline for comparison with the 2009 survey results. The 2009 survey questions mirrored the 2001 survey with a few alterations to reflect changes that have taken place over the past eight years, including questions related to proposed projects; i.e., completed and newly-proposed light rail extensions, proposed Downtown/Riverfront Street Car Project, and a question related to teleworking.

In addition to the responses to the multiple choice questions, the DGS received comments from approximately 3,700 individuals covering a wide range of topics, including observations on transit service, alternative transportation opportunities, and reasons for driving alone to work. The DGS is categorizing these comments so that they can be forwarded on to appropriate public agencies for their information.

The 2001 and 2009 surveys were conducted via electronic media with a small percentage of respondents utilizing a hard copy version of the survey questions. For the State Your Mode 2009 Survey, the DGS Office of Strategic Planning, Policy and Research (OSPPR) utilized the web-based survey tool, SurveyMonkey. The survey was placed on the DGS internet. The DGS Asset Management Branch also worked through agency deputy directors for administration, transportation coordinators, and public information officers to promote the survey. Data collected from SurveyMonkey was compiled by the OSPPR.

# State Your Mode 2009 State Employee Commute Survey

## FINDINGS

Findings from the survey responses include:

- Regionwide, 45 percent of the employees drive alone to work; for those working in the City of Sacramento core area, 34 percent report they drive alone.
- Top three reasons people report they drive alone to work are: no reasonable transit options; people need their car at work for personal reasons; and anything else takes too long.
- Regionwide, 27 percent of the employees use public transit; for those working in the City of Sacramento Core Area, 36 percent report they use public transit to commute.
- Top three reasons that motivate people to choose alternate forms of commute are: high fuel costs; high parking costs; and wear and tear savings on personal vehicles.
- Top three reasons that would encourage people not to drive alone are: telework; more frequent transit service; and monthly cash subsidy for using alternative commute mode.
- 37 percent of respondents commute from the east (Interstate 80 & Highway 50 Corridor); 28 percent commute from the south (South of Fruitridge Boulevard); and 4 percent from the city core area.
- 66 percent of respondents reported one-way commutes of 10 plus miles.
- Over 70 percent of the respondents indicated they would be interested in participating in a telework program.






