

Please consider the following comments in the final review of Title 24, Part 5, Chapters 16 and 17.

1. **1601.0 - 1601.9** - As chapter 16 addresses gray water primarily (3 of the 4 points under the chapter's "Intent" heading are specific to gray water), I would suggest renaming the chapter to suggest that it applies to gray water systems, and repeating any of the content from 1601.0 - 1601.9 that apply to other nonpotable sources in the appropriate chapter.

If this is not done, semantic consistency needs to be addressed. (E.g. **1601.2 System Design**--this item presumably applies to all alternate water sources, but it includes reference to 'Complex Systems,' which is a designation that only applies to gray water--this is confusing when interpreting from the rainwater perspective.)

2. **1701.1 Applicability** - if the above suggestion is incorporated, remove the language here that refers the reader back to Ch. 16.

3. **Table 1702.9.4 - Car Washing:** Is a 100micron filter for drip irrigation meant to be included as a minimum treatment requirement for car washing? It seems this could have been included as an oversight.

4. **1702.9.5.5** - Typo: "...as required by in accordance with this code..." ("as required by..." OR "in accordance with...")

5. **Ch 17 general:** as a rainwater harvesting professional, it would be nice to have some clarity in the code regarding pipe color for nonpotable rainwater distribution in the landscape. I have heard that white pipe with a yellow stripe is specified elsewhere in the code for nonpotable distribution, although this doesn't seem to be well known in the industry. There is also some conflicting opinion in the industry as to whether or not purple pipe should be used for nonpotable rainwater distribution lines. It would be nice if Ch. 17 could address pipe color directly.
