

**Suggested Revisions to the Text of the Regulations:**

In the previous code cycle the Statement of Reasons noted that " DSA-AC is amending the model code to delete provisions which do not meet the minimum existing accessibility requirements of the 2010 California Building Code. The ADA Standards provide a lower level of accessibility than CBC 1133B.1.1.1.1 which requires all entrances and exterior ground-floor exit doors comply with the accessibility requirements for doors and entrances." Removing the prescriptive language would deprive the user of the necessary information to the location of accessible entrances and exits. The proposed building standard is not unreasonable, arbitrary, unfair, or capricious, in whole or in part.
