SACRAMENTO – The California Department of General Services (DGS) is holding its quarterly Surplus Property Auction featuring hundreds of items as part of an end-of-summer blowout. From horse saddles, couches and running shoes—there’s something for everyone.

The DGS Office of Fleet and Asset Management will conduct the auction on Saturday, Sept. 17, at the surplus warehouse at 1700 National Dr. in Sacramento. The media can preview items on Thursday, Sept. 15 between 8 a.m. and 12 p.m.

Items include laptops and office furniture from state agencies, property seized by the California Highway Patrol and those confiscated by the National Transportation Security Administration.

The auction brings in hundreds of thousands of dollars back to the state every year.
