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**State Vehicles and More Up for Auction**  
*Vehicles eliminated at Governor Brown's order*

SACRAMENTO – The California Department of General Services (DGS) announced today that it will auction more than 240 cars, trucks, trailers, boats, and more on Wednesday, November 14, 2012, starting at 9 a.m. This auction will contain vehicles that are considered “runners” and will take place at the Davis Auction Yard located at 5950 Chiles Road in Davis.

The vehicles and equipment will be sold as a result of Governor Brown's order to eliminate all non-essential vehicles ([Executive Order B-2-11](#)). That order resulted in state agencies identifying more than [7,100 vehicles](#) to eliminate. Over the next year, DGS will sell these vehicles and equipment at auctions in Davis and southern California. All items are sold “as is” with no warranties, guarantees, adjustments, repairs, refunds, or exchanges.

Items that are considered “runners” may be driven off of the lot. “Non-runners” do not meet requirements in the Vehicle Code to be considered operable; however, this does not necessarily mean the item does not operate. Items considered “non-runners” **must** be towed off of the lot.

Two previous auctions of vehicles eliminated at the Governor's order have generated approximately \$1.2 million through the sale of 814 items.
