In early May 2006, approximately 20 preschool children enrolled in the child care program at the Education Building, located at 15th and N Streets in Sacramento, took part in “Growing California Green” activities.



The Education Building has earned the U.S. Green Building Council's LEED-NC (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Gold certification for new construction.

This summer, the building is expected to become the first state-owned office building to earn LEED-EB certification for an existing building.



Theo—also known as Thriftasaurus Save-a-wattus—led the children on a tour of the facility—one of California’s most environment-friendly, “green” office buildings. Here, they learn about diverting waste from landfills.



Theo showed the kids some of the many ways the facility—in which many of their parents work—is designed to save energy, water and other natural resources.



During their building tour, the preschoolers carried signs conveying conservation tips.





The green building tour and conservation tips are part of the state's commitment to reducing energy use at state-owned facilities while encouraging others to do the same at home and at work.
