Overview

The Department of General Services (DGS), Real Estate Services Division, received \$2.971 million (Service Revolving Fund) to secure private consultants to pursue Leadership in Energy Efficiency and Design for Existing Buildings (LEED-EB) goals for 11 DGS-owned State office buildings.

Pursuant to the Supplemental Report Language Item 1760-001-0666 1(a), the DGS will report to the Legislature describing the schedule proposed for existing State buildings to achieve LEED certification and Energy Star rating by 2015 and the schedule for achieving retro-commissioning, including a list of buildings proposed to be retro-commissioned.

LEED Certification

The DGS, in conjunction with the LEED-EB Consultant, is developing and deploying a comprehensive LEED-Existing Building (EB) Certification/Recertification/Training Program. The program is designed to be a model and knowledge base for use by all State agencies when certifying their buildings and developing in-house LEED certification expertise. The procedure illustrated in the attached chart outlines a 10-step process to implement many of the management policies that will earn LEED-EB points and lead the facility team to achieve LEED-EB certification. While the diagram is cyclical, any of these steps will assist in the final success of creating a sustainable building and can be approached in any order.

There are approximately 210 State-owned facilities that fall under the LEED-EB certification requirements of Executive Order S-20-04 (buildings greater than 50,000 square feet), of which 58 are DGS-owned and/or operated. The DGS is applying the portions of the program that have been developed towards its portfolio of buildings (see attached program schedule). The DGS is working with the US Green Building Council on a model for volume registration of its entire portfolio, as well as implementing its recently developed Best Practices Manual as a precursor to the LEED-EB certification process.

In addition, the DGS has sponsored focused LEED training of its professional staff with the goal of certifying all appropriate staff as LEED Accredited Professionals. DGS will be providing a detailed legislative report of its LEED training activities pursuant to Item 1760-001-0666 1(c) in January 2008. The DGS is offering this training to other state agencies and proactively working with facility staffs throughout the state.

Other outreach efforts include presentations at the Green Action Team meetings, the DGS Partnership Council, discussions with Agency Undersecretaries and the

development and implementation of the [Green California](#) website which provides a gateway for the latest information about how the State of California is working to reduce energy and resource consumption, while lowering greenhouse gas emissions, and creating healthier environments in which to work, live and learn.

Energy Star Ratings

Executive Order S-20-04 requires State departments to benchmark all occupied buildings by December 2007. At the direction of the California Energy Commission, State departments are using the US Environmental Protection Agency ENERGY STAR Portfolio Manager (PM) program for this task.

Benchmarks vs. Ratings

The Benchmarking Work Group (BMWG; comprised primarily of the DGS, the California Energy Commission (CEC) and the Utilities), in consultation with the CEC, has designated “Btu per square foot per year” as the benchmark measure. The PM program calculates this value for every facility. Percentage changes in this number will be used to evaluate departments’ progress towards meeting the 20 percent goal by 2015.

The PM program was designed to analyze and produce ENERGY STAR ratings for only 8 building types. It also has metering rules and size thresholds. State buildings which meet these prerequisites will receive a rating in the PM program. Many State buildings, however, will not qualify for an ENERGY STAR rating because they fall outside of the program’s allowable parameters. Per the Green Building Action Plan, for those buildings that cannot receive a rating it is expected that the California Energy Commission will develop an efficiency goal equivalent to an ENERGY STAR rating of 75.

Implementation Steps

1. Portfolio Manager accounts created for departments by BMWG.
2. Obtain approximately 90 percent of utility information automatically from participating utilities via XML protocols.
3. Obtain approximately 10 percent of utility information from department records or from non-XML utility data dumps.

Status

To date, 97percent of the executive branch departments have supplied all or some information to the BMWG. There are currently 793 benchmarkable facilities comprising over 97 million square feet in the Portfolio Manager program.

Automatic XML Utility Data Acquisition

The following utilities are implementing automatic data transfer of historical and current utility usage and cost information via XML protocol over the Web:

- Pacific Gas and Electric – in operation
- Southern California Edison – in operation
- San Diego Gas and Electric – ready by December 31, 2007
- Southern California Gas – ready by December 31, 2007
- Sacramento Municipal Utility District – in limited operation

Manual Utility Data Acquisition

- The BMWG suggested departments attempt to obtain utility information from the non-XML (non-participating) utilities in electronic form for simple uploading into PM.
- Data not obtained from the utilities will be gathered from department records.
- The DGS is coordinating with and assisting State agencies in their manual utility data acquisition and uploading tasks.

Retro-commissioning

The DGS is administering the statewide retro-commissioning program in response to Executive Order (E.O.) S-20-04. The E.O. and its accompanying Green Building Action Plan stipulates that all State-owned buildings greater than 50,000 square feet be retro-commissioned, and then re-commissioned on a 5-year cycle. Of the approximately 210 buildings greater than 50,000 square feet, 95 are currently on the statewide retro-commissioning program schedule (see attached). The remaining buildings, comprised mainly of warehouses, barns, and open-air facilities, are not strong candidates for retro-commissioning due to their very simplistic or non-existent mechanical and electrical systems.

Of the 25 projects for 2006/07, 24 will have investigative reports completed by December 31, 2007. DGS is working with all of the State agencies on the implementation of the recommended energy efficiency measures. The 20 projects in the 2007/08 schedule are set to begin in December 2007.

COMMENTS:

- NOTE: The schedule has changed since the time of the BCP submittal for the following reasons: The DGS was approved in July 2007 by the USGBC to participate in a pilot program for LEED-EB Initial Submittals for Volume Certification. The entire portfolio of DGS buildings will be registered and initiate the certification process at the same time. This volume certification process along with the input of the LEED consultant and PYs' may impact the original BCP submitted schedule. For those reasons the stated schedule may deviate and/or excel from the previous stated schedule.
- The original submitted schedule was based upon scheduling the LEED certification after completion of buildings being first retro-commissioned. LEED-EB credits involve retro-commissioning (RCx) or commissioning (Cx) of the facility with a 1-5 year plan in place to implement recommended measures. USGBC is scheduled to release a revised LEED for High Performance Operations version for 2008. Under the revised LEED standards, the RCx will continue to contribute to LEED certification points. In the future the LEED certification may no longer follow but instead precede the RCx schedule.
- Schedule exchange between Franchise Tax Board-Sac.SF.TC Bldgs.(084) and California Towers (330). The California Towers RCx was placed on hold due to the need of capitol energy measures project completion.
- Unlike DGS Owned and Operated Buildings, these buildings are DGS Operated and Agency Owned. LEED certification dependent upon agency approval and participation.
