### CASE FILINGS


During the first quarter for fiscal year 2008-2009, the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) received 701 new case filings.

Matters filed – Month to Month Comparison




Cases by Filing Party

Overall, the cases filed are comprised of 550 student filed cases, 86 district filed cases, one student filed expedited hearing, and three student filed cases involving expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).<sup>3</sup> Additionally, 36 student filed and 25 district filed mediation only requests were received.

In summary, OAH received 701 requests for mediation related to due process hearing or mediation-only this quarter.<sup>4</sup> Of the 701 requests for mediation, 61 were requests for mediation only.<sup>5</sup> The remaining 640 requests for mediation were related to due process hearing requests.<sup>6</sup> Of the total requests for due process hearing, four involved expedited issues.<sup>7</sup>



### Legal Representation

The requests for due process hearing (DPH) filed by students were filed with legal representation in 72 percent of student filed cases (398 cases). The requests for due process hearing filed by districts were filed with legal representation in 84 percent of district filed cases (72 cases).<sup>8</sup>


### Grade Level

The majority of cases originated from students in the primary grades (335 cases) followed by those in high school (161 cases), preschool (92 cases), and junior high school (73 cases). Data on the grade level of the student was not specified in 40 of the case filings.<sup>9</sup>




### Issues and Remedies

Cases filed this quarter raised a variety of issues and requested remedies. The number of issues raised varied per case, with some cases only raising one issue and others raising several issues. The most common issues raised were placement (438 cases) and assessment (286 cases). Other issues included: speech and language services (249 cases), designated instruction and services (229 cases), ABA or one-to-one aide services (167 cases), goals and objectives (115 cases), occupational therapy services (169 cases), eligibility (70 cases), extended school year services (78 cases), mental health services (22 cases), procedural violations (32 cases), discipline (3 cases), and private services (122 cases). Compensatory education was requested as a remedy in 213 cases and reimbursement was requested as a remedy in 242 cases.<sup>10</sup>


Eligibility Category <sup>11</sup>

The majority of cases filed involved students identified under the eligibility category of autistic-like behaviors (226 cases). Other identified areas of eligibility included: Specific Learning disability (96 cases), Emotional Disturbance (64 cases), Other Health Impaired (124 cases), Speech and Language disorder (113 cases), Mental Retardation (30 cases), Hearing Impairment (15 cases), Visually Impaired (8 cases), Multiple Disabilities (18 cases), orthopedic impairment (10 cases), traumatic brain injury (5 cases), Deafness (11 cases) and one Deaf/Blind case. The student’s area of eligibility was not identified in 149 cases.<sup>12</sup>

**CLOSED CASES**

During this Quarter, 762 cases were closed. Currently, 542 matters remain pending. Of the 542 matters pending, 512 are related to due process hearing requests and 30 are related to Mediation Only requests.\* Of the 762 cases closed, 682 were related to due process hearing requests and 80 were related to Mediation Only requests.\* Overall this quarter, of the 682 due process cases, 658 (96%) were resolved in some manner without need for a due process hearing.<sup>13\*</sup> For the fiscal year to date, 97 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing. The majority of cases resolved outside the mediation or resolution session process (291 cases), followed by those resolved during mediation (228 cases), and those resolved during the resolution session (35 cases). A number of cases (142 cases) were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation. Additionally, seven cases were dismissed via a motion to dismiss, 16 cases were dismissed after failing to amend following a notice of insufficiency, nine cases were dismissed due to inactivity, and ten cases were closed for other reasons. Finally, 24 cases were closed following a full hearing and decision on the merits.





### Mediations

This quarter 461 mediations were held. Of these mediations, 46 were continued for an additional mediation date. Of the 461 mediations held, 404 were related to due process hearing requests, one case was related to a dual hearing request (which involve expedited and non-expedited issues) and 56 were related to mediation only requests. For mediation requests related to due process hearing requests, 260 cases reached an agreement,<sup>18</sup> and 36 mediation only cases reached an agreement. In the one dual hearing case that went to mediation, the parties did not reach an agreement.<sup>19</sup> Mediation was successful in 296<sup>20</sup> cases (64 percent of the time), with 119 mediations resulting in impasse. At the end of this quarter, 255 cases have mediations pending<sup>21</sup> and 509 cases have hearings pending.<sup>22</sup>

For the current fiscal year, OAH has conducted 461 mediations with 119 resulting in impasse. Overall for this fiscal year, the mediation success rate is 66 percent.



### Due Process Hearings

During this Quarter, final decisions were issued in 24 cases. Of the 24 decisions issued, five decisions were issued within the 45 day timeline, 17 were issued within the 45 day timeline plus extension, and two were issued late.<sup>23</sup> Regarding cases with expedited issues, no decisions were issued and no changes of placement were ordered for this quarter.<sup>24</sup> Overall, this quarter, 96 percent of decisions were issued within the requisite timeline. For the current fiscal year, OAH has issued 24 decisions and 96 percent of decisions have been issued within the requisite timelines.

For the decisions issued this quarter, students prevailed in four hearings (16 percent). Districts prevailed in eight hearings (34 percent). In 12 cases (50 percent), the decision was split between student and district with students prevailing on 45 issues and districts prevailing on 61 issues.<sup>25</sup> For the current fiscal year, students have prevailed in four hearings (16 percent), districts have prevailed in eight hearings (34 percent), and 12 cases (50 percent) resulted in a








Of the decisions issued, four cases case involved a preschool student, ten cases involved elementary school students, six cases involved middle school students, and four cases involved high school students.

On average, the due process hearings lasted five days, with students using 54 percent of the hearing for presentation of their case and districts using 45 percent of hearing time for case presentation. During case presentation, each side called an average of five witnesses per case.

### Resolution Sessions

The IDEA requires school districts to hold resolution sessions within 15 days of receipt of a student's complaint. While there is no legal requirement to report this data to OAH, we request that school districts inform us if they held a resolution and the outcome of that session. This quarter, 46 resolution sessions were reported as held and eight were reported as not held. Three resolution sessions that were reported to OAH were related to expedited issues.<sup>27</sup>


### Motions

Prehearing motions and Notices of Insufficiency (NOI) comprise a substantial amount of the work completed by administrative law judges. For this quarter, 397 prehearing motions and 82 NOIs were considered and ruled upon by OAH. Of the 397 prehearing motions that were ruled on by OAH, 147 were filed by parents, 91 were filed by districts and 159 were stipulated.<sup>28</sup>

The prehearing motions encompassed a variety of issues with the largest number involving motions to continue (229 motions).

There were 397 prehearing motions filed this quarter. Of the 91 motions filed by districts, 51 were granted, six were granted in part and 31 were denied. Of the 147 motions filed by students, 86 were granted, two were granted in part and 56 were denied. The remaining motions were stipulated, moot, or withdrawn.<sup>29</sup> Of the 82 NOIs filed, 32 were found insufficient, 28 were partially sufficient, and 22 were sufficient. No cases were dismissed for insufficiency.<sup>30</sup>

### NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS AND INTERPRETERS

During this quarter, 24 non-English speaking students were identified through the due process hearing request forms.<sup>31</sup> Of the 24 non-English speaking students, 20 were Spanish speaking, two were identified as using American Sign Language, one spoke Cantonese and one Arabic speaking student was identified. OAH received 14 requests for the assistance of a Spanish interpreter.



### STUDENTS OF COLOR

CDE has requested OAH collect data on the number of “students of color accessing the system.” To facilitate this request, effective January 1, 2007, OAH amended its due process hearing request form to include this request. However, not all hearing requests are made using the OAH form. This quarter, 18 students self reported as being a “student of color” and 45 students self reported as not being a “student of color.”<sup>32</sup> The remaining students did not state if they were a “student of color.”



### TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND APPEALS

This quarter, OAH received 30 requests for transcripts. This quarter, OAH was notified that an appeal was filed on 35 cases.<sup>33</sup> Data on the number of appeals and appellate outcomes is collected on an ongoing basis. It includes all cases that OAH was notified were appealed since July 2005. Based on correspondence with the parties and filings that have been provided to OAH, 147 cases have been appealed since July 2005. Currently, 53 OAH decisions are on appeal. Since July 2005, 20 decisions have been upheld, five decisions have been remanded, four decisions were reversed, 20 cases settled, 37 were dismissed, and four cases were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation.



Due to the difficulty in identifying which cases are appealed and the appellate outcomes, parties are invited to notify OAH of any cases not included below or outcomes that are not identified below.

### **MEDIATION AND HEARING EVALUATIONS**

Under its contract with CDE, OAH is required to send evaluations to all parties attending mediations and hearings. The evaluations contain a 1 through 5 rating scale, with 1 being Poor/Very dissatisfied and 5 being Excellent/extremely satisfied. The evaluations ask the parties to evaluate the mediation, the administrative law judge and OAH in general.

This quarter, 360 mediation evaluations were returned to OAH. Evaluations were completed by parents (59 cases), legal counsel for parents (30 cases), parent advocates (11 cases) school district representatives (101 cases), and legal counsel for district (36 cases). In 123 cases, the evaluator did not indicate their role in the mediation.
