The Interagency Agreement (IA) between the California Department of Education (CDE) and the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) requires the OAH to report on a quarterly basis certain information related to mediations, due process and expedited hearings, as well as information required to be maintained according to state and federal law and regulations.¹ The following report addresses those IA reporting requirements.

CASE FILINGS²

During the first quarter for fiscal year 2009-2010, the OAH received 682 new case filings.³

Cases by Filing Party

Overall, there were 682 total cases filed this quarter, which consisted of 549 student filed cases, 67 district filed cases, and three student filed cases involving both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁵ The 682 cases filed this quarter also included 35 student filed and 25 district filed mediation only requests. The three remaining cases were filed by students requesting a due process hearing only. A detailed list of all student filed cases this quarter broken down by district appears in Attachment B beginning on page 23.

In summary, OAH received 679 requests for mediation related to due process hearing or mediation-only this quarter.⁶ Of the 679 requests for mediation, 60 were requests for mediation only.⁷ The remaining 619 requests for mediation were related to due process hearing requests.⁸ Of the total requests for due process hearing, three student filed cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues(dual hearings).⁹



Legal Representation

During the first quarter, 682 requests for due process were filed, which consisted of 590 student filed requests and 92 requests filed by districts. Of the 590 cases filed by students requesting due process, 399 cases (68 percent) were filed by attorneys. Of the 92 district filed cases, 60 cases (65 percent) were filed by attorneys.¹⁰ Of the 682 cases filed this quarter, 459 cases (67 percent) were filed by attorneys.



Grade Level

The majority of the 682 cases filed this quarter originated from students in the primary grades (308 cases), followed by those in high school (170 cases), junior high school (103 cases) and preschool (71 cases). The grade level of the student was not specified in 30 of the case filings.¹¹



Issues and Remedies

Cases filed this quarter raised a variety of issues and requested remedies. The number of issues raised varied per case, with some cases raising only one issue, and others raising several issues. The most common issues raised in the 682 cases filed this quarter, were placement (396 cases) and assessment (238 cases). Other issues included: speech and language services (192 cases), designated instruction and services (184 cases), one-to-one aide services (122 cases), goals and objectives (74 cases), occupational therapy services (116 cases), eligibility (41 cases), extended school year services (21 cases), mental health services (32 cases), procedural violations (60 cases), discipline (eight cases), ABA services (nine cases), and private services (30 cases). Compensatory education was requested as a remedy in 193 cases and reimbursement was requested as a remedy in 236 cases.¹²

Eligibility Category ¹³


The majority of cases filed this quarter involved students identified under the eligibility category of autistic-like behaviors (212 cases). Other identified areas of eligibility included: Speech and Language disorder (130 cases), Specific Learning Disability (114 cases), Other Health Impaired (108 cases), Emotional Disturbance (69 cases), Mental Retardation (39 cases), Hearing Impairment (19 cases), Visually Impaired (15 cases), Orthopedic Impairment (15 cases), Deafness (12 cases), Traumatic Brain Injury (two cases) and Deaf/Blindness (two cases). The student's area of eligibility was not identified in 158 cases.¹⁴



1st Quarter Eligibility Categories



CLOSED CASES

During this Quarter, 538 cases were closed. Currently, 717 matters remain pending.¹⁵ Of the 717 matters pending, 672 are related to due process hearing requests and 45 are related to mediation only requests. Of the 538 cases closed, 493 were related to due process hearing requests and 45 were related to mediation only requests.

Overall this quarter, 493 due process cases and 45 mediation only cases were closed, for a total of 538 cases closed. Of the 493 due process cases closed, 468 (95%) were resolved in some manner without need for a due process hearing.¹⁶ For the fiscal year to date, 95 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing.




The majority of cases closed this quarter were settled outside the mediation or resolution session process (201 cases), followed by those that resolved during mediation (166 cases), and those cases withdrawn by the filing party without explanation (95 cases). Additionally this quarter, 20 cases resolved during the resolution session, 10 cases were dismissed after failing to amend following a notice of insufficiency, six cases were dismissed via a motion to dismiss, two cases were dismissed due to inactivity, one case resolved via a settlement conference and 12 cases were closed for other reasons. Out of 538 cases closed this quarter, 25 were closed following a full hearing and decision on the merits.



Mediations

This quarter, 432 mediations were held. The mediations were held in matters opened this quarter and in matters that were pending from prior quarters. Of the 432 mediations held this quarter, 40 were continued for an additional mediation date. Of the 432 mediations held, 376 were related to due process hearing requests, two cases were related to a dual hearing request (which involve expedited and non-expedited issues) and 54 were related to mediation only requests. For mediation requests related to due process hearing, 227 cases reached an agreement at mediation,¹⁷ and 31 mediation only cases reached an agreement. In the two cases involving expedited issues that went to mediation, the parties in one case reached an agreement.¹⁸

Out of the 432 mediations held this quarter, mediation was successful in 258¹⁹ cases (60 percent), with 174 mediations resulting in impasse. At the end of this quarter, 263 cases have mediations pending²⁰ and 672 cases have hearings pending.²¹




For the 2009-2010 fiscal year, OAH has conducted 432 mediations, with 258 resulting in an agreement and 174 resulting in impasse. For the first quarter of fiscal year 2009-2010, the mediation success rate is 60 percent. For the first quarter of fiscal year 2009-2010, 95 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing decision.



Due Process Hearings

During the first quarter, out of the 538 cases closed, 25 final decisions were issued. Of the 25 decisions issued, four decisions were issued within the 45 day timeline, 19 were issued within the 45 day timeline plus extension, two were issued within 20 days for a case with expedited issues, and no decisions were issued late.²² Two decisions were issued on a case with expedited issues and no changes of placement were ordered for this quarter.²³ Overall, this quarter, 100 percent of decisions were issued within the requisite timeline. For the first quarter of fiscal year 2009-2010, OAH has issued 25 decisions and 100 percent of decisions have been issued within the requisite timelines.



Based upon the issues for hearing identified by the parties, students prevailed on all issues in two hearings (eight percent) and districts prevailed on all issues in 17 hearings (68 percent). In six of the 25 decisions issued (24 percent), the issues in the decision were split between student and district, with students prevailing on 15 issues and districts prevailing on 43 issues.²⁴ For the current fiscal year, students have prevailed on all issues in two hearings (eight percent), districts have prevailed on all issues in 17 hearings (68 percent), and six cases (24 percent) resulted in a split decision of the issues. Copies of all decisions have been provided to CDE and have been posted on the OAH website.

Of the 25 decisions issued this quarter, one case involved a preschool student, 15 cases involved elementary school students, six cases involved middle school students, and three cases involved high school students.

On average, the due process hearings lasted four days, with students using 48 percent of the hearing time to present their case and districts using 52 percent of hearing time for case presentation. During case presentation, each side called an average of five witnesses per case.

The hearings involved multiple areas of disability. The greatest number of cases involved students identified with Autistic-Like Behaviors (eight cases) and Specific Learning Disabilities (eight cases). The other cases involved Other Health Impairments (four cases), Mental Retardation (two cases), Emotional Disturbance (one case), Speech and Language Impairment (one case) and Visual Impairment (one case).

Resolution Sessions

The IDEA requires school districts to hold resolution sessions within 15 days of receipt of a student’s complaint. While there is no legal requirement to report this data to the OAH, CDE requests that the OAH track this information. Accordingly, the OAH sends letters to school districts asking if they held a resolution session and the outcome of that session. This quarter, based on the information the OAH received, 114 resolution sessions were reported as held and 63 were reported as not held. Of the 114 resolutions sessions reported as held, no cases were regarding expedited matters.²⁵

Motions

Prehearing motions and Notices of Insufficiency (NOI) comprise a substantial amount of the work completed by administrative law judges. For this quarter, 364 prehearing motions and 53 NOIs were filed by the parties and considered and ruled upon by OAH. Of the 364 prehearing motions that were ruled on by OAH, 74 were filed by parents, 53 were filed by districts and 237 motions were stipulated or ruled moot.²⁶ Of the 53 NOIs filed, 20 were found insufficient, 11 were partially sufficient, and 22 were sufficient. No cases were dismissed for insufficiency.²⁷

There were 364 prehearing motions filed this quarter. Of the 53 motions filed by districts, 31 were granted, three were granted in part and 19 were denied. Of the 74 motions filed by students, 41 were granted, one was granted in part and 32 were denied. The remaining 237 motions filed by either students or districts were resolved by stipulation, determined to be moot, or withdrawn by the parties.²⁸

The prehearing motions encompassed a variety of issues, with the largest number involving motions to continue (256 motions).



NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS AND INTERPRETERS

During this quarter, 115 non-English speaking students were identified through the due process hearing request forms.²⁹ Of the 115 non-English speaking students, 98 were Spanish speaking, four were Korean speaking, four spoke Arabic and three were Vietnamese speaking. Additionally, two students were identified in each category for speaking Russian, Japanese, and American Sign Language. OAH received 42 requests for the assistance of an interpreter.

STUDENTS OF COLOR

CDE has requested that the OAH collect data on the number of “students of color accessing the system.” To facilitate this request, the OAH amended its due process hearing request form to include this request. However, not all hearing requests are made using the OAH form. This quarter, 13 students self reported as being a “student of color” and 35 students self reported as not being a “student of color.”³⁰ The remaining students did not state whether they were a “student of color.”


TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND APPEALS

Data on the number of appeals and appellate outcomes is collected on an ongoing basis. It includes all cases that OAH was notified were appealed since July 2005. This quarter, OAH received 24 requests for transcripts. This quarter, OAH was notified of four new appeals filed on Special Education cases.³¹

Based on correspondence with the parties and filings that have been provided to OAH, 153 cases have been appealed since July 2005. Currently, of the 153 cases that have been appealed, 50 OAH decisions are pending, 25 decisions issued by OAH have been upheld, seven decisions issued by OAH have been remanded, five decisions issued by OAH were reversed, 22 cases settled, 38 were dismissed, and six cases were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation.

A detailed list of cases on appeal and the outcomes after appeal is listed in Attachment C beginning at page 39. Due to the difficulty in identifying which cases are appealed and the appellate outcomes, parties are invited to notify OAH of any case on appeal or any outcome on appeal that is not included in Attachment C.

MEDIATION AND HEARING EVALUATIONS

Under its contract with CDE, OAH is required to send evaluations to all parties attending mediations and hearings. The evaluations contain a 1 through 5 rating scale, with 1 being Poor/Very dissatisfied and 5 being Excellent/Extremely satisfied. The evaluations ask the parties to evaluate the mediation, the administrative law judge and OAH in general.

This quarter, 196 mediation evaluations were returned to OAH. Evaluations were completed by parents (42 cases), legal counsel for parents (15 cases), parent advocates (four cases), school district representatives (52 cases), and legal counsel for district (12 cases). In 71 cases, the evaluator did not indicate their role in the mediation.
