QUARTERLY DATA REPORT
SECOND QUARTER 2010 - 2011 FISCAL YEAR
OCTOBER 1, 2010 - DECEMBER 31, 2010**

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The Interagency Agreement (IA) between the California Department of Education (CDE) and the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) requires OAH to report on a quarterly basis certain information related to mediations and due process and expedited hearings, as well as information required to be maintained according to state and federal law.¹ The following report addresses those IA reporting requirements.

CASE FILINGS²

During the second quarter of fiscal year 2010-2011, OAH received 628 new case filings.³

Cases by Filing Party

Overall, there were 628 total cases filed this quarter, which consisted of 538 student-filed cases and 90 district-filed cases. Of the student-filed cases, 10 cases involved expedited issues and nine cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁴ Of the district-filed cases, no case involved expedited issues or both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearing). Of the 628 cases filed, five requests by students and one request by district were for a due process hearing only. The 628 cases filed this quarter also included 27 student-filed and 24 district-filed mediation-only requests. A detailed list of all student-filed cases this quarter broken down by district appears in Attachment B beginning on page 23.

Of the 628 cases opened by OAH this quarter, 622 requests were for mediation related to due process hearing or mediation-only this quarter.⁵ Of the 622 requests for mediation, 51 were requests for mediation-only.⁶ The remaining 571 requests for mediation were related to due process hearing requests.⁷ Of the total requests for mediation, nine student-filed cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁸



Legal Representation

During the second quarter, 628 requests for due process were filed, which consisted of 538 student-filed requests and 90 district-filed requests. Of the 538 cases filed by students requesting due process, 418 cases (78 percent) were filed by attorneys. Of the 90 district-filed cases, 62 cases (69 percent) were filed by attorneys.⁹ Of the 628 cases filed this quarter, 480 cases (77 percent) were filed by attorneys. This fiscal year, 77 percent of student cases and 77 percent of district cases were filed with legal representation.



Grade Level

The majority of the 628 cases filed this quarter originated from students in the primary grades (306 cases), followed by those in high school (167 cases), junior high school (81 cases) and preschool (65 cases). The grade level of the student was not specified in 9 of the case filings.¹⁰



Issues and Remedies

Cases filed this quarter involved a variety of issues and requested remedies. The number of issues raised varied per case, with some cases raising only one issue, and others raising several issues. The most common issues raised in the 628 cases filed this quarter, were placement (287 cases) and assessment (267 cases). Other issues included: designated instruction and services (214 cases), speech and language services (164 cases), occupational therapy services (109 cases), procedural violations (99 cases), one-to-one aide services (84 cases), goals and objectives (50 cases), eligibility (44 cases), mental health services (41 cases), extended school year services (26 cases) and private services (14 cases). Compensatory education was requested as a remedy in 230 cases and reimbursement was requested as a remedy in 185 cases.¹¹

Eligibility Category ¹²

The majority of cases filed this quarter involved students identified under the eligibility category of Autistic-Like Behaviors (212 cases). Other identified areas of eligibility included: Specific Learning Disability (101 cases), Speech or Language Impairment (91 cases), Other Health Impaired (79 cases), Emotional Disturbance (71 cases), Intellectual Disability¹³ (31 cases), Orthopedic Impairment (14 cases), Deafness (11 cases), Visually Impaired (six cases), Hearing Impairment (three cases), Deaf/Blind (two cases) and Traumatic Brain Injury (one case). The student's area of eligibility was not identified in 110 cases.¹⁴







CLOSED CASES

During this quarter, 610 cases were closed. Currently, 568 cases remain pending.¹⁵ Of the 568 cases pending, 542 are related to due process hearing requests and 26 are related to mediation-only requests. Of the 610 cases closed, 569 were related to due process hearing requests and 41 were related to mediation-only requests. Of the 610 cases closed, 594 (97%) were resolved in some manner without need for a due process hearing.¹⁶ For the fiscal year to date, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing.



The majority of cases closed this quarter were settled outside the mediation or resolution session process (253 cases), followed by those that resolved during mediation (187 cases), and those cases withdrawn by the filing party without explanation (110 cases). Additionally this quarter, 11 cases resolved during the resolution session, 10 cases were dismissed after failing to amend following a notice of insufficiency, eight cases were dismissed due to inactivity, seven mediation-only cases were not settled at mediation, five cases were dismissed by a motion to dismiss, and three cases were closed for other reasons. Out of the 610 cases closed this quarter, 16 were closed following a hearing and decision on the merits.




Mediations

This quarter, 322 mediations were held. The mediations were held in cases opened this quarter and in cases that were pending from prior quarters. Of the 322 mediations held this quarter, in 41 cases an additional mediation session was scheduled. Of the 322 mediations held, 284 were related to due process hearing requests, three cases involved expedited issues, two cases were related to a dual hearing request (which involve expedited and non-expedited issues) and 33 were related to mediation-only requests.

For mediation requests related to due process hearing, 182 cases reached an agreement at mediation,¹⁷ and 23 mediation-only cases reached an agreement, for a total of 205 cases resulting in an agreement.¹⁸ In the five cases involving expedited issues that went to mediation, three cases reached an agreement.¹⁹

Out of the 322 mediations held this quarter, mediation was successful in 205²⁰ cases (64 percent), with 117 mediations resulting in impasse. At the end of this quarter, 300 cases have mediations pending²¹ and 568 cases have hearings pending.²²




For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, OAH has conducted 764 mediations, with 509 resulting in an agreement and 255 resulting in impasse. The overall mediation success rate for fiscal year 2010-2011 is 67 percent. Overall for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing decision.



Due Process Hearings

During the second quarter, out of the 610 cases closed, 16 final decisions were issued. Of the 16 decisions issued, no decisions were issued within the standard 45-day timeline, 16 were issued within the 45-day timeline plus extension, and no decisions were issued late.²³ No decisions were issued on a case with expedited issues and no changes of placement were ordered for this quarter.²⁴ Overall, this quarter, 100 percent of decisions were issued within the requisite timeline. For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, OAH has issued 47 decisions and 100 percent have been issued within the requisite timelines.



Based upon the issues for hearing identified by the parties, students prevailed on all issues in two hearings (13 percent) and districts prevailed on all issues in 11 hearings (69 percent). In three of the 16 decisions issued (19 percent), the issues in the decision were split between student and district, with students prevailing on seven issues and districts prevailing on 23 issues.²⁵ For the current fiscal year, students have prevailed on all issues in six hearings (13 percent), districts have prevailed on all issues in 30 hearings (64 percent), and 11 cases (23 percent) resulted in a split decision of the issues. Copies of all decisions have been provided to CDE and have been posted on the OAH website.

Of the 16 decisions issued this quarter, three cases involved a preschool student, four cases involved elementary school students, three cases involved middle school students, and six cases involved high school students.

On average, the due process hearings lasted three days, with students using 45 percent of the hearing time to present their cases and districts using 55 percent of hearing time for case presentation.²⁶ During case presentation, each side called an average of five witnesses per case.²⁷

The hearings involved multiple areas of disability. The greatest number of cases involved students identified with Autistic-Like Behaviors (five cases) and Speech or Language Impairment (three cases). The other cases involved students with an Emotional Disturbance (two cases), Other Health Impairments (two cases), Specific Learning Disability (two cases), Orthopedic Impaired (one case) and Traumatic Brain Injury (one case).

Resolution Sessions

The IDEA requires school districts to hold resolution sessions within 15 days of receipt of a student’s complaint. While there is no legal requirement to report this data to OAH, CDE requests that OAH track this information. Accordingly, OAH sends letters to school districts asking if they held a resolution session and the outcome of that session. This quarter, based on the information OAH received, 108 resolution sessions were reported as held and 123 were reported as not held. Of the 108 resolutions sessions reported as held, two cases were regarding expedited cases.²⁸

Motions

Prehearing motions and Notices of Insufficiency (NOI) comprise a substantial amount of the work completed by administrative law judges. For this quarter, 362 prehearing motions and 64 NOIs were filed by the parties and considered and ruled upon by OAH. Of the 362 prehearing motions that were ruled on by OAH, 107 were filed by students, 122 were filed by districts and 133 motions were stipulated or ruled moot.²⁹ Of the 64 NOIs filed, 11 were found insufficient, 7 were partially sufficient, and 46 were sufficient. Ten cases were dismissed for insufficiency, after failing to amend the complaint.³⁰ OK, leave as is. Thanks.

There were 362 prehearing motions filed this quarter. Of the 107 motions filed by students, 57 were granted, three were granted in part and 47 were denied. Of the 122 motions filed by districts, 69 were granted, 13 were granted in part, 40 were denied and one was determined to be moot. Of the remaining 133 stipulated motions filed by either students or districts, 126 were granted and seven were denied.³¹

The prehearing motions involved a variety of issues, with the largest number involving motions to continue (160 motions).



NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS AND INTERPRETERS

During this quarter, 64 non-English-speaking students were identified through the due process hearing request forms.³² Of the 64 non-English-speaking students, 55 students spoke Spanish, four students spoke Mandarin, two students used American Sign Language, one student spoke Japanese, one spoke Russian and one student spoke Vietnamese. OAH received 51 requests for the assistance of an interpreter at a hearing or mediation.

STUDENTS OF COLOR


CDE has requested that OAH collect data on the number of students of color accessing the system. To facilitate this request, OAH amended its due process hearing request form to ask the parties to voluntarily provide this information. However, not all hearing requests are made using the OAH form. This quarter, 12 students reported as being a student of color and 33 students reported as not being a student of color.³³ The remaining students did not state whether they were a student of color.

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND APPEALS

Data on the number of appeals and appellate outcomes are collected on an ongoing basis and include all cases that OAH was notified were appealed since July 2005. This quarter, OAH received 25 requests for transcripts, and was notified of fifteen new appeals filed on cases.³⁴

Based on correspondence with the parties and filings that have been provided to OAH, 192 cases have been appealed since July 2005. Currently, of the 192 cases that have been appealed, 73 are pending a decision from an appellate court, 32 decisions issued by OAH have been upheld, eight decisions issued by OAH have been remanded, eight decisions issued by OAH were reversed, 25 cases settled, 41 were dismissed, and five cases were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation.

Due to the difficulty in identifying which cases are appealed and the appellate outcomes, parties are invited to notify OAH of any case on appeal or any outcome on appeal that is not included in Attachment C.

MEDIATION AND HEARING EVALUATIONS

OAH is required to send evaluations to all parties attending mediations and hearings. The evaluations contain a rating scale of 1 to 5, with 1 being poor/very dissatisfied and 5 being excellent/extremely satisfied. The evaluations ask the parties to evaluate the mediation, the administrative law judge and OAH in general.

This quarter, 158 mediation evaluations were returned to OAH. Evaluations were completed by parents (34 cases), legal counsel for parents (10 cases), advocates for parents (seven cases), school district representatives (44 cases), and legal counsel for districts (13 cases). In 50 cases, the evaluator did not indicate his or her role in the mediation.
