The Interagency Agreement (IA) between the California Department of Education (CDE) and the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) requires the OAH to report on a quarterly basis certain information related to mediations, due process and expedited hearings, as well as information required to be maintained according to state and federal law and regulations.¹ The following report addresses those IA reporting requirements. A footnote indicates when the reported information addresses a certain section of the IA.

CASE FILINGS²

During the third quarter for fiscal year 2008-2009, the OAH received 616 new case filings.



Cases by Filing Party

Overall, there were 616 total cases filed this quarter, which consist of 479 student filed cases, 77 district filed cases, four student filed expedited hearings and nine student filed cases involving both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁴ The 616 cases filed this quarter also included 23 student filed and 24 district filed mediation only requests.

In summary, OAH received 616 requests for mediation related to due process hearing or mediation-only this quarter.⁵ Of the 616 requests for mediation, 47 were requests for mediation only.⁶ The remaining 569 requests for mediation were related to due process hearing requests.⁷ Of the total requests for due process hearing, 13 involved expedited issues.⁸






Legal Representation

During the third quarter, 616 requests for hearings were filed, which consisted of 515 student filed requests for hearing and 101 requests filed by districts. Of the 515 cases filed by students requesting due process, 370 cases (72 percent) were filed by attorneys. Of the 101 district filed cases, 71 cases (70 percent) were filed by attorneys.⁹ Of the 616 cases filed this quarter, 441 cases (72 percent) were filed by attorneys.




Grade Level

The majority of the 616 cases filed this quarter originated from students in the primary grades (243 cases) followed by those in high school (159 cases), junior high school (108 cases) and preschool (83 cases). The grade level of the student was not specified in 23 of the case filings.¹⁰


Issues and Remedies

Cases filed this quarter raised a variety of issues and requested remedies. The number of issues raised varied per case, with some cases raising only one issue, while others raising several issues. The most common issues raised in the 616 cases filed this quarter, were placement (321 cases) and assessment (241 cases). Other issues included: speech and language services (190 cases), designated instruction and services (244 cases), ABA or one-to-one aide services (135 cases), goals and objectives (76 cases), occupational therapy services (138 cases), eligibility (52 cases), extended school year services (38 cases), mental health services (29 cases), procedural violations (65 cases), discipline (14 cases), and private services (74 cases). Compensatory education was requested as a remedy in 220 cases and reimbursement was requested as a remedy in 242 cases.¹¹


Eligibility Category ¹²

The majority of cases filed this quarter involved students identified under the eligibility category of autistic-like behaviors (188 cases). Other identified areas of eligibility included: Specific Learning Disability (153 cases), Emotional Disturbance (98 cases), Other Health Impaired (108 cases), Speech and Language disorder (130 cases), Mental Retardation (32 cases), Hearing Impairment (15 cases), Visually Impaired (13 cases), Multiple Disabilities (24

cases), Orthopedic Impairment (16 cases), Traumatic Brain Injury (three cases) and Deafness (three cases). The student’s area of eligibility was not identified in 117 cases.¹³

CLOSED CASES

During this Quarter, 582 cases were closed. Currently, 549 matters remain pending.¹⁴ Of the 549 matters pending, 537 are related to due process hearing requests and 12 are related to Mediation Only requests. Of the 582 cases closed, 534 were related to due process hearing requests and 48 were related to Mediation Only requests.

Overall this quarter, 534 due process cases and 48 mediation only cases were closed, for a total of 582 cases closed. Of the 534 due process cases closed, 506 (95%) were resolved in some manner without need for a due process hearing.¹⁵ For the fiscal year to date, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing. The majority of cases this quarter were settled outside the mediation or resolution session process (226 cases), followed by those that resolved during mediation (153 cases), and the cases withdrawn by the filing party without explanation (114 cases). Additionally this quarter, 15 cases were dismissed due to inactivity, 14 cases resolved during the resolution session, nine cases were dismissed via a motion to dismiss, two cases were dismissed after failing to amend following a notice of insufficiency, one case resolved via a settlement conference and 20 cases were closed for other reasons. Out of 582 cases closed this quarter, 28 were closed following a full hearing and decision on the merits.



Mediations

This quarter, 339 mediations were held. The mediations were held in matters opened this quarter and in matters that were pending from prior quarters. Of the 339 mediations held this quarter, 26 were continued for an additional mediation date. Of the 339 mediations held, 305 were related to due process hearing requests, one case was related to an expedited case, one case was related to a dual hearing request (which involve expedited and non-expedited issues) and 32 were related to mediation only requests. For mediation requests related to due process hearing, 175 cases reached an agreement at mediation,²⁰ and 20 mediation only cases reached



an agreement. In the two cases involving expedited issues that went to mediation, the parties in both cases reached an agreement.²¹

Out of the 339 mediations held this quarter, mediation was successful in 197²² cases (58 percent), with 142 mediations resulting in impasse. At the end of this quarter, 301 cases have mediations pending²³ and 537 cases have hearings pending.²⁴

For the current fiscal year, OAH has conducted 1164 mediations, with 698 resulting in an agreement and 466 resulting in impasse. Overall for this fiscal year, the mediation success rate is 60 percent.



Due Process Hearings

During the third quarter, out of the 582 cases closed, 28 final decisions were issued. Of the 28 decisions issued, three decisions were issued within the 45 day timeline, 22 were issued within the 45 day timeline plus extension, one was issued within 20 days for a case with expedited issues, and two were issued late.²⁵ One decision was issued on a case with expedited



issues and no changes of placement were ordered for this quarter.²⁶ Overall, this quarter, 93 percent of decisions were issued within the requisite timeline. For the current fiscal year, OAH has issued 72 decisions and 92 percent of decisions have been issued within the requisite timelines.




This quarter, 28 decisions were issued. Based upon the issues for hearing identified by the parties, students prevailed on all issues in three hearings (11 percent) and districts prevailed on all issues in 16 hearings (57 percent). In nine of the 28 decisions issued (32 percent), the issues in the decision were split between student and district, with students prevailing on 30 issues and districts prevailing on 66 issues.²⁷ For the current fiscal year, students have prevailed on all issues in 10 hearings (14 percent), districts have prevailed on all issues in 36 hearings (50 percent), and 26 cases (36 percent) resulted in a split decision of the issues. Copies of all decisions have been provided to CDE and have been posted on the OAH website.






Of the decisions issued, four cases involved a preschool student, eight cases involved elementary school students, two cases involved middle school students, and 14 cases involved high school students.

On average, the due process hearings lasted four days, with students using 56 percent of the hearing time to present their case and districts using 44 percent of hearing time for case presentation. During case presentation, each side called an average of six witnesses per case.

Resolution Sessions

The IDEA requires school districts to hold resolution sessions within 15 days of receipt of a student’s complaint. While there is no legal requirement to report this data to OAH, we request that school districts inform us if they held a resolution session and the outcome of that session. This quarter, 97 resolution sessions were reported as held and 40 were reported as not held. Of the 97 resolutions sessions reported as held, two were regarding expedited matters.²⁹

Motions

Prehearing motions and Notices of Insufficiency (NOI) comprise a substantial amount of the work completed by administrative law judges. For this quarter, 278 prehearing motions and 62 NOIs were considered and ruled upon by OAH. Of the 278 prehearing motions that were ruled on by OAH, 66 were filed by parents, 83 were filed by districts and 129 were settled by way of a stipulation.³⁰



There were 278 prehearing motions filed this quarter. Of the 83 motions filed by districts, 46 were granted, five were granted in part, one was found to be moot, and 31 were denied. Of the 66 motions filed by students, 34 were granted, two were granted in part and 30 were denied. The remaining motions filed by either students or districts were resolved by stipulation, determined to be moot, or withdrawn by the parties.³¹ Of the 62 NOIs filed, 19 were found insufficient, 17 were partially sufficient, and 26 were sufficient. No cases were dismissed for insufficiency.³²

NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS AND INTERPRETERS

During this quarter, 78 non-English speaking students were identified through the due process hearing request forms.³³ Of the 78 non-English speaking students, 65 were Spanish speaking, three were Korean speaking, two were Armenian speaking and two were Chinese speaking. Additionally, one student was identified in each category for speaking Arabic,

Russian, Tagalog, Tongan, Turkish, and Vietnamese. OAH received 28 requests for the assistance of an interpreter.



STUDENTS OF COLOR

CDE has requested OAH collect data on the number of “students of color accessing the system.” To facilitate this request, effective January 1, 2007, OAH amended its due process hearing request form to include this request. However, not all hearing requests are made using the OAH form. This quarter, 30 students self reported as being a “student of color” and 31 students self reported as not being a “student of color.”³⁴ The remaining students did not state whether they were a “student of color.”



TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND APPEALS

This quarter, OAH received 32 requests for transcripts. This quarter, OAH was not notified of any new appeals filed on Special Education cases.³⁵ Data on the number of appeals and appellate outcomes is collected on an ongoing basis. It includes all cases that OAH was notified were appealed since July 2005. Based on correspondence with the parties and filings that have been provided to OAH, 149 cases have been appealed since July 2005. Currently, Of the 149 cases that have been appealed, 48 OAH decisions are pending, 25 decisions issued by OAH have been upheld, six decisions issued by OAH have been remanded, five decisions issued by OAH were reversed, 21 cases settled, 38 were dismissed, and six cases were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation.

MEDIATION AND HEARING EVALUATIONS

Under its contract with CDE, OAH is required to send evaluations to all parties attending mediations and hearings. The evaluations contain a 1 through 5 rating scale, with 1 being Poor/Very dissatisfied and 5 being Excellent/Extremely satisfied. The evaluations ask the parties to evaluate the mediation, the administrative law judge and OAH in general.

This quarter, 283 mediation evaluations were returned to OAH. Evaluations were completed by parents (50 cases), legal counsel for parents (12 cases), parent advocates (nine cases), school district representatives (83 cases), and legal counsel for district (33 cases). In 96 cases, the evaluator did not indicate their role in the mediation.
