The Interagency Agreement (IA) between the California Department of Education (CDE) and the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) requires the OAH to report on a quarterly basis certain information related to mediations, due process and expedited hearings, as well as information required to be maintained according to state and federal law and regulations.¹ The following report addresses those IA reporting requirements.

CASE FILINGS²

During the third quarter for fiscal year 2009-2010, the OAH received 603 new case filings.³

Cases by Filing Party

Overall, there were 603 total cases filed this quarter, which consisted of 461 student filed cases, 76 district filed cases, six student filed cases involving expedited issues, and eight student filed cases and one district filed case involving both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁴ The 603 cases filed this quarter also included 28 student filed and 19 district filed mediation only requests. The four remaining cases were filed by students requesting a due process hearing only. A detailed list of all student filed cases this quarter broken down by district appears in Attachment B beginning on page 22.

In summary, OAH received 599 requests for mediation related to due process hearing or mediation-only this quarter.⁵ Of the 599 requests for mediation, 47 were requests for mediation only.⁶ The remaining 552 requests for mediation were related to due process hearing requests.⁷ Of the total requests for due process hearing, eight student filed cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁸



Legal Representation

During the third quarter, 603 requests for due process were filed, which consisted of 507 student filed requests and 96 requests filed by districts. Of the 507 cases filed by students requesting due process, 373 cases (74 percent) were filed by attorneys. Of the 96 district filed cases, 76 cases (79 percent) were filed by attorneys.⁹ Of the 603 cases filed this quarter, 449 cases (74 percent) were filed by attorneys.



Grade Level

The majority of the 603 cases filed this quarter originated from students in the primary grades (283 cases), followed by those in high school (153 cases), junior high school (78 cases) and preschool (76 cases). The grade level of the student was not specified in 13 of the case filings.¹⁰



Issues and Remedies

Cases filed this quarter raised a variety of issues and requested remedies. The number of issues raised varied per case, with some cases raising only one issue, and others raising several issues. The most common issues raised in the 603 cases filed this quarter, were placement (281 cases) and assessment (240 cases). Other issues included: speech and language services (146 cases), designated instruction and services (180 cases), one-to-one aide services (88 cases), goals and objectives (65 cases), occupational therapy services (83 cases), eligibility (47 cases), extended school year services (21 cases), mental health services (24 cases), procedural violations (49 cases), discipline (five cases), and private services (19 cases). Compensatory education was requested as a remedy in 212 cases and reimbursement was requested as a remedy in 202 cases.¹¹

Eligibility Category ¹²


The majority of cases filed this quarter involved students identified under the eligibility category of autistic-like behaviors (181 cases). Other identified areas of eligibility included: Speech or Language Impairment (92 cases), Specific Learning Disability (103 cases), Other Health Impaired (96 cases), Emotional Disturbance (75 cases), Mental Retardation (31 cases), Hearing Impairment (11 cases), Visually Impaired (five cases), Orthopedic Impairment (16 cases), Deafness (10 cases), Deaf/Blind (two cases) and Traumatic Brain Injury (one case). The student's area of eligibility was not identified in 116 cases.¹³



3rd Quarter Eligibility Categories



CLOSED CASES

During this quarter, 520 cases were closed. Currently, 636 matters remain pending.¹⁴ Of the 636 matters pending, 591 are related to due process hearing requests and 45 are related to mediation only requests. Of the 520 cases closed, 488 were related to due process hearing requests and 32 were related to mediation only requests.

Overall this quarter, 488 due process cases and 32 mediation only cases were closed, for a total of 520 cases closed. Of the 488 due process cases closed, 473 (97%) were resolved in some manner without need for a due process hearing.¹⁵ For the fiscal year to date, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing.




The majority of cases closed this quarter were settled outside the mediation or resolution session process (259 cases), followed by those that resolved during mediation (118 cases), and those cases withdrawn by the filing party without explanation (105 cases). Additionally this quarter, eight cases resolved during the resolution session, four cases were dismissed after failing to amend following a notice of insufficiency, one case was dismissed via a motion to dismiss, one case was dismissed due to inactivity, one case was closed after a settlement conference and eight cases were closed for other reasons. Out of the 520 cases closed this quarter, 15 were closed following a full hearing and decision on the merits.



Mediations

This quarter, 326 mediations were held. The mediations were held in matters opened this quarter and in matters that were pending from prior quarters. Of the 326 mediations held this quarter, 22 were continued for an additional mediation date. Of the 326 mediations held, 292 were related to due process hearing requests, four cases involved expedited issues, one case was related to a dual hearing request (which involve expedited and non-expedited issues) and 29 were related to mediation only requests. For mediation requests related to due process hearing, 168 cases reached an agreement at mediation,¹⁶ and 18 mediation only cases reached an agreement. In the eight cases involving expedited issues that went to mediation, three cases reached an agreement.¹⁷

Out of the 326 mediations held this quarter, mediation was successful in 186¹⁸ cases (57 percent), with 140 mediations resulting in impasse. At the end of this quarter, 297 cases have mediations pending¹⁹ and 591 cases have hearings pending.²⁰




For the 2009-2010 fiscal year, OAH has conducted 1022 mediations, with 547 resulting in an agreement and 475 resulting in impasse. The overall mediation success rate for fiscal year 2009-2010 is 54 percent. Overall for the 2009-2010 fiscal year, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing decision.



Due Process Hearings

During the third quarter, out of the 520 cases closed, 15 final decisions were issued. Of the 15 decisions issued, one decision was issued within the 45 day timeline, 13 were issued within the 45 day timeline plus extension and one decision was issued late.²¹ No decisions were issued on a case with expedited issues and no changes of placement were ordered for this quarter.²² Overall, this quarter, 93 percent of decisions were issued within the requisite timeline. For the 2009-2010 fiscal year, OAH has issued 65 decisions and 98 percent of decisions have been issued within the requisite timelines.



Based upon the issues for hearing identified by the parties, students prevailed on all issues in three hearings (20 percent) and districts prevailed on all issues in eight hearings (53 percent). In four of the 15 decisions issued (27 percent), the issues in the decision were split between student and district, with students prevailing on 22 issues and districts prevailing on 13 issues.²³ For the current fiscal year, students have prevailed on all issues in 11 hearings (17 percent), districts have prevailed on all issues in 39 hearings (60 percent), and 15 cases (23 percent) resulted in a split decision of the issues. Copies of all decisions have been provided to CDE and have been posted on the OAH website.

Of the 15 decisions issued this quarter, one case involved a preschool student, six cases involved elementary school students, one case involved middle school students, and seven cases involved high school students.

On average, the due process hearings lasted three days, with students using 58 percent of the hearing time to present their case and districts using 42 percent of hearing time for case presentation.²⁴ During case presentation, each side called an average of five witnesses per case.²⁵

The hearings involved multiple areas of disability. The greatest number of cases involved students identified with Autistic-Like Behaviors (three cases), Other Health Impairments (three cases), Specific Learning Disability (three cases) and Emotional Disturbance (three cases). The other cases involved students with a Speech or Language Impairment (one case), Hearing Impaired (one case), and Orthopedic Impaired (one case).

Resolution Sessions

The IDEA requires school districts to hold resolution sessions within 15 days of receipt of a student’s complaint. While there is no legal requirement to report this data to the OAH, CDE requests that the OAH track this information. Accordingly, the OAH sends letters to school districts asking if they held a resolution session and the outcome of that session. This quarter, based on the information the OAH received, 123 resolution sessions were reported as held and 102 were reported as not held. Of the 123 resolutions sessions reported as held, five cases were regarding expedited matters.²⁶

Motions

Prehearing motions and Notices of Insufficiency (NOI) comprise a substantial amount of the work completed by administrative law judges. For this quarter, 241 prehearing motions and 52 NOIs were filed by the parties and considered and ruled upon by OAH. Of the 241 prehearing motions that were ruled on by OAH, 53 were filed by parents, 53 were filed by districts and 135 motions were stipulated or ruled moot.²⁷ Of the 52 NOIs filed, 16 were found insufficient, 12 were partially sufficient, and 24 were sufficient. No cases were dismissed for insufficiency.²⁸

There were 241 prehearing motions filed this quarter. Of the 56 motions filed by districts, 24 were granted, five were granted in part, 24 were denied and three were withdrawn. Of the 53 motions filed by students, 33 were granted, three were granted in part, 15 were denied and two were withdrawn. The remaining 132 motions filed by either students or districts were resolved by stipulation, determined to be moot, or withdrawn by the parties.²⁹

The prehearing motions encompassed a variety of issues, with the largest number involving motions to continue (139 motions).



NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS AND INTERPRETERS

During this quarter, 58 non-English speaking students were identified through the due process hearing request forms.³⁰ Of the 58 non-English speaking students, 51 were Spanish speaking, two students used American Sign Language and two spoke Farsi. Additionally, one student was identified in each category for speaking Korean, Japanese and Vietnamese. OAH received 40 requests for the assistance of an interpreter.

STUDENTS OF COLOR


CDE has requested that the OAH collect data on the number of “students of color accessing the system.” To facilitate this request, the OAH amended its due process hearing request form to ask the parties to voluntarily provide this information. However, not all hearing requests are made using the OAH form. This quarter, 16 students self reported as being a “student of color” and 34 students self reported as not being a “student of color.”³¹ The remaining students did not state whether they were a “student of color.”

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND APPEALS

Data on the number of appeals and appellate outcomes is collected on an ongoing basis and includes all cases that OAH was notified were appealed since July 2005. This quarter, OAH received 32 requests for transcripts, and was notified of seven new appeals filed on Special Education cases.³²

Based on correspondence with the parties and filings that have been provided to OAH, 166 cases have been appealed since July 2005. Currently, of the 166 cases that have been appealed, 63 OAH decisions are pending, 25 decisions issued by OAH have been upheld, seven decisions issued by OAH have been remanded, five decisions issued by OAH were reversed, 22 cases settled, 38 were dismissed, and six cases were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation.

Due to the difficulty in identifying which cases are appealed and the appellate outcomes, parties are invited to notify OAH of any case on appeal or any outcome on appeal that is not included in Attachment C.

MEDIATION AND HEARING EVALUATIONS

Under its contract with CDE, OAH is required to send evaluations to all parties attending mediations and hearings. The evaluations contain a 1 through 5 rating scale, with 1 being Poor/Very dissatisfied and 5 being Excellent/Extremely satisfied. The evaluations ask the parties to evaluate the mediation, the administrative law judge and OAH in general.

This quarter, 210 mediation evaluations were returned to OAH. Evaluations were completed by parents (51 cases), legal counsel for parents (19 cases), an advocate for parents (4 cases), school district representatives (62 cases), and legal counsel for district (21 cases). In 53 cases, the evaluator did not indicate their role in the mediation.
