QUARTERLY DATA REPORT
FOURTH QUARTER 2008/2009 FISCAL YEAR
April 1, 2009 – June 30, 2009**

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The Interagency Agreement (IA) between the California Department of Education (CDE) and the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) requires the OAH to report on a quarterly basis certain information related to mediations, due process and expedited hearings, as well as information required to be maintained according to state and federal law and regulations.¹ The following report addresses those IA reporting requirements. A footnote indicates when the reported information addresses a certain section of the IA.

CASE FILINGS²

During the fourth quarter for fiscal year 2008-2009, the OAH received 832 new case filings.



Cases by Filing Party

Overall, there were 832 total cases filed this quarter, which consisted of 646 student filed cases, 90 district filed cases, six student filed expedited hearings, and 13 student filed and two district filed cases involving both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁴ The 832 cases filed this quarter also included 51 student filed and 17 district filed mediation only requests. The seven remaining cases were filed by students requesting a due process hearing only.

In summary, OAH received 825 requests for mediation related to due process hearing or mediation-only this quarter.⁵ Of the 825 requests for mediation, 68 were requests for mediation only.⁶ The remaining 757 requests for mediation were related to due process hearing requests.⁷ Of the total requests for due process hearing, 21 involved expedited issues.⁸






Legal Representation

During the third quarter, 832 requests for due process were filed, which consisted of 723 student filed requests and 109 requests filed by districts. Of the 723 cases filed by students requesting due process, 447 cases (62 percent) were filed by attorneys. Of the 109 district filed cases, 80 cases (73 percent) were filed by attorneys.⁹ Of the 832 cases filed this quarter, 527 cases (63 percent) were filed by attorneys.




Grade Level

The majority of the 832 cases filed this quarter originated from students in the primary grades (391 cases) followed by those in high school (188 cases), junior high school (117 cases) and preschool (113 cases). The grade level of the student was not specified in 23 of the case filings.¹⁰


Issues and Remedies

Cases filed this quarter raised a variety of issues and requested remedies. The number of issues raised varied per case, with some cases raising only one issue, while others raising several issues. The most common issues raised in the 832 cases filed this quarter, were placement (373 cases) and assessment (290 cases). Other issues included: speech and language services (200 cases), designated instruction and services (209 cases), ABA or one-to-one aide services (136 cases), goals and objectives (71 cases), occupational therapy services (127 cases), eligibility (38 cases), extended school year services (39 cases), mental health services (33 cases), procedural violations (39 cases), discipline (12 cases), and private services (32 cases). Compensatory education was requested as a remedy in 218 cases and reimbursement was requested as a remedy in 237 cases.¹¹

Eligibility Category ¹²


The majority of cases filed this quarter involved students identified under the eligibility category of autistic-like behaviors (232 cases). Other identified areas of eligibility included: Specific Learning Disability (132 cases), Emotional Disturbance (81 cases), Other Health Impaired (102 cases), Speech and Language disorder (130 cases), Mental Retardation (37 cases), Hearing Impairment (15 cases), Visually Impaired (19 cases), Multiple Disabilities (22 cases), Orthopedic Impairment (18 cases), Traumatic Brain Injury (one case), Deafness (nine

cases) and Deaf/Blindness (two cases). The student's area of eligibility was not identified in 239 cases.¹³

CLOSED CASES

During this Quarter, 760 cases were closed. Currently, 595 matters remain pending.¹⁴ Of the 595 matters pending, 585 are related to due process hearing requests and 10 are related to mediation only requests. Of the 760 cases closed, 708 were related to due process hearing requests and 52 were related to mediation only requests.

Overall this quarter, 708 due process cases and 52 mediation only cases were closed, for a total of 760 cases closed. Of the 708 due process cases closed, 676 (96%) were resolved in some manner without need for a due process hearing.¹⁵ For the fiscal year to date, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing. The majority of cases this quarter were settled outside the mediation or resolution session process (315 cases), followed by those that resolved during mediation (209 cases), and the cases withdrawn by the filing party without explanation (139 cases). Additionally this quarter, seven cases were dismissed due to inactivity, 22 cases resolved during the resolution session, 15 cases were dismissed via a motion to dismiss, 19 cases were dismissed after failing to amend following a notice of insufficiency, one case resolved via a settlement conference and one case was closed for other reasons. Out of 760 cases closed this quarter, 32 were closed following a full hearing and decision on the merits.



Mediations


This quarter, 421 mediations were held. The mediations were held in matters opened this quarter and in matters that were pending from prior quarters. Of the 421 mediations held this quarter, 39 were continued for an additional mediation date. Of the 421 mediations held, 366 were related to due process hearing requests, four cases were related to an expedited case, two cases were related to a dual hearing request (which involve expedited and non-expedited issues) and 49 were related to mediation only requests. For mediation requests related to due process hearing, 231 cases reached an agreement at mediation,²⁰ and 25 mediation only cases reached an agreement. In the six cases involving expedited issues that went to mediation, the parties in all six cases reached an agreement.²¹

Out of the 421 mediations held this quarter, mediation was successful in 256²² cases (61 percent), with 165 mediations resulting in impasse. At the end of this quarter, 339 cases have mediations pending²³ and 585 cases have hearings pending.²⁴

For the 2008-2009 fiscal year, OAH has conducted 1585 mediations, with 954 resulting in an agreement and 631 resulting in impasse. Overall for 2008-2009 fiscal year, the mediation success rate is 60 percent.



Due Process Hearings

During the fourth quarter, out of the 760 cases closed, 32 final decisions were issued. Of the 32 decisions issued, three decisions were issued within the 45 day timeline, 26 were issued within the 45 day timeline plus extension, two were issued within 20 days for a case with expedited issues, and one was issued late.²⁵ Two decisions were issued on a case with expedited issues and no changes of placement were ordered for this quarter.²⁶ Overall, this quarter, 97 percent of decisions were issued within the requisite timeline. For the 2008-2009 fiscal year, OAH has issued 104 decisions and 93 percent of decisions have been issued within the requisite timelines.





This quarter, 32 decisions were issued. Based upon the issues for hearing identified by the parties, students prevailed on all issues in six hearings (19 percent) and districts prevailed on all issues in 14 hearings (43 percent). In 12 of the 32 decisions issued (38 percent), the issues in the decision were split between student and district, with students prevailing on 34 issues and districts prevailing on 99 issues.²⁷ For the current fiscal year, students have prevailed on all issues in 16 hearings (15 percent), districts have prevailed on all issues in 50 hearings (48 percent), and 38 cases (37 percent) resulted in a split decision of the issues. Copies of all decisions have been provided to CDE and have been posted on the OAH website.






Of the decisions issued, one case involved a preschool student, ten cases involved elementary school students, four cases involved middle school students, and 17 cases involved high school students.

On average, the due process hearings lasted four days, with students using 52 percent of the hearing time to present their case and districts using 48 percent of hearing time for case presentation. During case presentation, each side called an average of six witnesses per case.

The hearings involved multiple areas of disability. The greatest number of cases involved students identified with Autistic-Like Behaviors (eight cases) and Specific Learning Disabilities (eight cases). The other cases involved, Other Health Impairments (three cases), Emotional Disturbance (five cases), Mental Retardation (three cases), Orthopedic Impairment (one case) and Speech and Language (four cases).

Resolution Sessions

The IDEA requires school districts to hold resolution sessions within 15 days of receipt of a student’s complaint. While there is no legal requirement to report this data to OAH, we request that school districts inform us if they held a resolution session and the outcome of that session. This quarter, 68 resolution sessions were reported as held and 60 were reported as not held. Of the 68 resolutions sessions reported as held, no cases were regarding expedited matters.²⁹

Motions

Prehearing motions and Notices of Insufficiency (NOI) comprise a substantial amount of the work completed by administrative law judges. For this quarter, 331 prehearing motions and 82 NOIs were considered and ruled upon by OAH. Of the 331 prehearing motions that were ruled on by OAH, 96 were filed by parents, 80 were filed by districts and 155 were settled by way of a stipulation.³⁰

The prehearing motions encompassed a variety of issues with the largest number involving motions to continue (191 motions).



There were 331 prehearing motions filed this quarter. Of the 80 motions filed by districts, 47 were granted, six were granted in part, two were found to be moot, and 25 were denied. Of the 96 motions filed by students, 53 were granted, three were granted in part, one was found to be moot and 39 were denied. The remaining 155 motions filed by either students or districts were resolved by stipulation, determined to be moot, or withdrawn by the parties.³¹ Of the 82 NOIs filed, 23 were found insufficient, 28 were partially sufficient, and 31 were sufficient. No cases were dismissed for insufficiency.³²

NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS AND INTERPRETERS

During this quarter, 84 non-English speaking students were identified through the due process hearing request forms.³³ Of the 84 non-English speaking students, 68 were Spanish speaking, four were Armenian speaking, three for American Sign Language, and two each were identified speaking Tagalog and Portuguese. Additionally, one student was identified in each category for speaking Vietnamese, Russian, Japanese, Arabic, and Hindi. OAH received 20 requests for the assistance of an interpreter.



STUDENTS OF COLOR

CDE has requested OAH collect data on the number of “students of color accessing the system.” To facilitate this request, effective January 1, 2007, OAH amended its due process hearing request form to include this request. However, not all hearing requests are made using the OAH form. This quarter, 38 students self reported as being a “student of color” and 58 students self reported as not being a “student of color.”³⁴ The remaining students did not state whether they were a “student of color.”



TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND APPEALS

This quarter, OAH received 29 requests for transcripts. This quarter, OAH was not notified of any new appeals filed on Special Education cases.³⁵ Data on the number of appeals and appellate outcomes is collected on an ongoing basis. It includes all cases that OAH was notified were appealed since July 2005. Based on correspondence with the parties and filings that have been provided to OAH, 149 cases have been appealed since July 2005. Currently, Of the 149 cases that have been appealed, 46 OAH decisions are pending, 25 decisions issued by OAH have been upheld, seven decisions issued by OAH have been remanded, five decisions issued by OAH were reversed, 22 cases settled, 38 were dismissed, and six cases were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation.

MEDIATION AND HEARING EVALUATIONS

Under its contract with CDE, OAH is required to send evaluations to all parties attending mediations and hearings. The evaluations contain a 1 through 5 rating scale, with 1 being Poor/Very dissatisfied and 5 being Excellent/Extremely satisfied. The evaluations ask the parties to evaluate the mediation, the administrative law judge and OAH in general.

This quarter, 206 mediation evaluations were returned to OAH. Evaluations were completed by parents (34 cases), legal counsel for parents (11 cases), parent advocates (seven cases), school district representatives (77 cases), and legal counsel for district (11 cases). In 66 cases, the evaluator did not indicate their role in the mediation.
