ORDER VACATING STATUS
CONFERENCE AND DISMISSING
STUDENT'S DUE PROCESS
COMPLAINT FOR FAILURE TO
PROSECUTE OR PARTICIPATE IN
THE DUE PROCESS PROCEEDINGS

On December 15, 2011, the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) issued an Order to Show Cause (OSC) why Student's complaint should not be dismissed for Student's repeated failure to prosecute or participate in the due process proceedings. OAH gave Student up to December 21, 2011 to respond in writing, and explain his repeated failure to appear and prosecute the due process complaint. The OSC also provided notice of a Status Conference scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on December 22, 2011, and further advised Student that failure to respond would result in an order vacating the Status Conference and dismissing the complaint. The OSC was translated into Spanish and served by mail on Student on December 16, 2011. Student failed to respond to the OSC.

Based upon the foregoing facts, the Status Conference scheduled for 10:00 a.m. is hereby vacated, and Student's complaint is dismissed.
