The Interagency Agreement (IA) between the California Department of Education (CDE) and the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) requires OAH to report on a quarterly basis certain information related to mediations, due process and expedited hearings, as well as information required to be maintained according to state and federal law.¹ The following report addresses those IA reporting requirements.

CASE FILINGS²

During the first quarter of fiscal year 2010-2011, OAH received 726 new case filings.³

Cases by Filing Party

Overall, there were 726 total cases filed this quarter, which consisted of 635 student-filed cases and 91 district-filed cases. Of the student-filed cases, three cases involved expedited issues and four cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁴ Of the district-filed cases, one case involved expedited issues and no cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearing). Of the 726 cases filed, one request by students and no requests by districts were for a due process hearing only. The 726 cases filed this quarter also included 17 student-filed and 10 district-filed mediation-only requests. A detailed list of all student-filed cases this quarter broken down by district appears in Attachment B beginning on page 23.

Of the 726 cases opened by OAH this quarter, 725 requests were for mediation related to due process hearing or mediation-only this quarter.⁵ Of the 725 requests for mediation, 27 were requests for mediation-only.⁶ The remaining 698 requests for mediation were related to due process hearing requests.⁷ Of the total requests for mediation, four student-filed cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁸



Legal Representation

During the first quarter, 726 requests for due process were filed, which consisted of 635 student-filed requests and 91 district-filed requests. Of the 635 cases filed by students requesting due process, 485 cases (76 percent) were filed by attorneys. Of the 91 district-filed cases, 76 cases (84 percent) were filed by attorneys.⁹ Of the 726 cases filed this quarter, 561 cases (77 percent) were filed by attorneys. This fiscal year, 76 percent of student cases and 84 percent of district cases were filed with legal representation.



Grade Level

The majority of the 726 cases filed this quarter originated from students in the primary grades (366 cases), followed by those in high school (158 cases), junior high school (101 cases) and preschool (91 cases). The grade level of the student was not specified in 10 of the case filings.¹⁰



Issues and Remedies

Cases filed this quarter involved a variety of issues and requested remedies. The number of issues raised varied per case, with some cases raising only one issue, and others raising several issues. The most common issues raised in the 726 cases filed this quarter, were placement (370 cases) and assessment (275 cases). Other issues included: designated instruction and services (233 cases), speech and language services (232 cases), occupational therapy services (134 cases), one-to-one aide services (116 cases), procedural violations (91 cases), goals and objectives (60 cases), eligibility (58 cases), extended school year services (42 cases), private services (40 cases), mental health services (22 cases) and discipline (four cases). Compensatory education was requested as a remedy in 248 cases and reimbursement was requested as a remedy in 245 cases.¹¹

Eligibility Category ¹²


The majority of cases filed this quarter involved students identified under the eligibility category of Autistic-Like Behaviors (291 cases). Other identified areas of eligibility included: Other Health Impaired (114 cases), Specific Learning Disability (105 cases), Speech or Language Impairment (101 cases), Emotional Disturbance (59 cases), Intellectual Disability¹³ (37 cases), Orthopedic Impairment (11 cases), Hearing Impairment (10 cases), Visually Impaired (nine cases), Deafness (four cases), Deaf/Blind (three cases) and Traumatic Brain Injury (one case). The student's area of eligibility was not identified in 129 cases.¹⁴



CLOSED CASES

During this quarter, 717 cases were closed. Currently, 601 cases remain pending.¹⁵ Of the 601 cases pending, 580 are related to due process hearing requests and 21 are related to mediation-only requests. Of the 717 cases closed, 678 were related to due process hearing requests and 39 were related to mediation-only requests.

Overall this quarter, 678 due process cases and 39 mediation-only cases were closed, for a total of 717 cases closed. Of the 717 cases closed, 686 (96%) were resolved in some manner without need for a due process hearing.¹⁶ For the fiscal year to date, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing.



The majority of cases closed this quarter were settled outside the mediation or resolution session process (327 cases), followed by those that resolved during mediation (221 cases), and those cases withdrawn by the filing party without explanation (91 cases). Additionally this quarter, 20 cases resolved during the resolution session, seven cases were dismissed by a motion to dismiss, six cases were dismissed due to inactivity, six cases were dismissed after failing to amend following a notice of insufficiency, five mediation-only cases were not settled at mediation, one case was closed after a settlement conference and two cases were closed for other reasons. Out of the 717 cases closed this quarter, 31 were closed following a full hearing and decision on the merits.



Mediations

This quarter, 442 mediations were held. The mediations were held in cases opened this quarter and in cases that were pending from prior quarters. Of the 442 mediations held this quarter, 28 were continued for an additional mediation date. Of the 442 mediations held, 412 were related to due process hearing requests, one case involved expedited issues, two cases were related to a dual hearing request (which involve expedited and non-expedited issues) and 27 were related to mediation-only requests. For mediation requests related to due process hearing, 285 cases reached an agreement at mediation,¹⁷ and 19 mediation-only cases reached an agreement. In the three cases involving expedited issues that went to mediation, two cases reached an agreement.¹⁸

Out of the 442 mediations held this quarter, mediation was successful in 304¹⁹ cases (69 percent), with 138 mediations resulting in impasse. At the end of this quarter, 275 cases have mediations pending²⁰ and 580 cases have hearings pending.²¹




For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, OAH has conducted 442 mediations, with 304 resulting in an agreement and 138 resulting in impasse. The overall mediation success rate for fiscal year 2010-2011 is 69 percent. Overall for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing decision.



Due Process Hearings

During the first quarter, out of the 717 cases closed, 31 final decisions were issued. Of the 31 decisions issued, one was issued on a case with expedited issues within the 20-day timeline, no decisions were issued within the 45-day timeline, 30 were issued within the 45-day timeline plus extension and no decisions were issued late.²² One decision was issued on a case with expedited issues and no changes of placement were ordered for this quarter.²³ Overall, this quarter, 100 percent of decisions were issued within the requisite timeline. For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, OAH has issued 31 decisions and 100 percent of decisions have been issued within the requisite timelines.



Based upon the issues for hearing identified by the parties, students prevailed on all issues in four hearings (13 percent) and districts prevailed on all issues in 19 hearings (61 percent). In eight of the 31 decisions issued (26 percent), the issues in the decision were split between student and district, with students prevailing on 23 issues and districts prevailing on 28 issues.²⁴ For the current fiscal year, students have prevailed on all issues in four hearings (13 percent), districts have prevailed on all issues in 19 hearings (61 percent), and eight cases (26 percent) resulted in a split decision of the issues. Copies of all decisions have been provided to CDE and have been posted on the OAH website.

Of the 31 decisions issued this quarter, no cases involved a preschool student, 16 cases involved elementary school students, six cases involved middle school students, and nine cases involved high school students.

On average, the due process hearings lasted four days, with students using 54 percent of the hearing time to present their cases and districts using 46 percent of hearing time for case presentation.²⁵ During case presentation, each side called an average of five witnesses per case.²⁶

The hearings involved multiple areas of disability. The greatest number of cases involved students identified with Autistic-Like Behaviors (eight cases), Specific Learning Disability (six cases), and Other Health Impairments (five cases). The other cases involved students with an Emotional Disturbance (three cases) and Intellectual Disability (three cases), Speech or Language Impairment (three cases), Visual Impairment (two cases) and Orthopedic Impaired (one case).

Resolution Sessions

The IDEA requires school districts to hold resolution sessions within 15 days of receipt of a student’s complaint. While there is no legal requirement to report this data to OAH, CDE requests that OAH track this information. Accordingly, OAH sends letters to school districts asking if they held a resolution session and the outcome of that session. This quarter, based on the information OAH received, 120 resolution sessions were reported as held and 118 were reported as not held. Of the 120 resolutions sessions reported as held, two cases were regarding expedited cases.²⁷

Motions

Prehearing motions and Notices of Insufficiency (NOI) comprise a substantial amount of the work completed by administrative law judges. For this quarter, 357 prehearing motions and 57 NOIs were filed by the parties and considered and ruled upon by OAH. Of the 357 prehearing motions that were ruled on by OAH, 82 were filed by students, 79 were filed by districts and 196 motions were stipulated or ruled moot.²⁸ Of the 57 NOIs filed, 11 were found insufficient, 14 were partially sufficient, and 32 were sufficient. No cases were dismissed for insufficiency.²⁹

There were 357 prehearing motions filed this quarter. Of the 82 motions filed by students, 46 were granted, five were granted in part, 30 were denied and one was moot. Of the 79 motions filed by districts, 49 were granted, six were granted in part, 22 were denied and two were moot. Of the remaining 196 stipulated motions filed by either students or districts, 190 were granted, five were denied and one was determined to be moot.³⁰

The prehearing motions involved a variety of issues, with the largest number involving motions to continue (222 motions).



NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS AND INTERPRETERS

During this quarter, 56 non-English-speaking students were identified through the due process hearing request forms.³¹ Of the 56 non-English-speaking students, 52 students spoke Spanish, two students spoke Korean, two students spoke Vietnamese, one student spoke Cantonese and one student spoke Thai. OAH received 67 requests for the assistance of an interpreter at a hearing or mediation.

STUDENTS OF COLOR


CDE has requested that OAH collect data on the number of students of color accessing the system. To facilitate this request, OAH amended its due process hearing request form to ask the parties to voluntarily provide this information. However, not all hearing requests are made using the OAH form. This quarter, 12 students reported as being a student of color and 66 students reported as not being a student of color.³² The remaining students did not state whether they were a student of color.

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND APPEALS

Data on the number of appeals and appellate outcomes are collected on an ongoing basis and include all cases that OAH was notified were appealed since July 2005. This quarter, OAH received 24 requests for transcripts, and was notified of five new appeals filed on cases.³³

Based on correspondence with the parties and filings that have been provided to OAH, 184 cases have been appealed since July 2005. Currently, of the 184 cases that have been appealed, 77 OAH decisions are pending, 28 decisions issued by OAH have been upheld, seven decisions issued by OAH have been remanded, five decisions issued by OAH were reversed, 22 cases settled, 39 were dismissed, and six cases were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation.

Due to the difficulty in identifying which cases are appealed and the appellate outcomes, parties are invited to notify OAH of any case on appeal or any outcome on appeal that is not included in Attachment C.

MEDIATION AND HEARING EVALUATIONS

Under its contract with CDE, OAH is required to send evaluations to all parties attending mediations and hearings. The evaluations contain rating scale of 1 to 5, with 1 being poor/very dissatisfied and 5 being excellent/extremely satisfied. The evaluations ask the parties to evaluate the mediation, the administrative law judge and OAH in general.

This quarter, 307 mediation evaluations were returned to OAH. Evaluations were completed by parents (70 cases), legal counsel for parents (17 cases), advocates for parents (six cases), school district representatives (82 cases), and legal counsel for districts (29 cases). In 103 cases, the evaluator did not indicate his or her role in the mediation.
