The Interagency Agreement (IA) between the California Department of Education (CDE) and the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) requires OAH to report on a quarterly basis certain information related to mediations and due process and expedited hearings, as well as information required to be maintained according to state and federal law.¹ The following report addresses those IA reporting requirements.

CASE FILINGS²

During the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2010-2011, OAH received 907 new case filings.³

Cases by Filing Party

Overall, there were 907 total cases filed this quarter, which consisted of 760 student-filed cases and 147 district-filed cases. Of the student-filed cases, nine cases involved expedited issues and 13 cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁴ Of the district-filed cases, one case involved expedited issues and no case involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearing). Of the 907 cases filed, four requests by students and one request by districts were for a due process hearing only. The 907 cases filed this quarter also included 40 student-filed and 28 district-filed mediation-only requests. A detailed list of all student-filed cases this quarter broken down by district appears in Attachment B beginning on page 22.

Of the 907 cases opened by OAH this quarter, 902 requests were for mediation related to due process hearing or mediation-only this quarter.⁵ Of the 902 requests for mediation, 68 were requests for mediation-only.⁶ The remaining 834 requests for mediation were related to due process hearing requests.⁷ Of the total requests for mediation, 13 student-filed cases involved both expedited and non-expedited issues (dual hearings).⁸



Legal Representation

During the fourth quarter, 907 requests for due process were filed, which consisted of 760 student-filed requests and 147 district-filed requests. Of the 760 cases filed by students requesting due process, 528 cases (69 percent) were filed by attorneys. Of the 147 district-filed cases, 114 cases (78 percent) were filed by attorneys.⁹ Of the 907 cases filed this quarter, 642 cases (71 percent) were filed by attorneys. This fiscal year, 75 percent of student cases and 77 percent of district cases were filed with legal representation.



Grade Level

The majority of the 907 cases filed this quarter originated from students in the primary grades (460 cases), followed by those in high school (183 cases), junior high school (137 cases) and preschool (102 cases). The grade level of the student was not specified in 25 of the case filings.¹⁰



Issues and Remedies

Cases filed this quarter involved a variety of issues and requested remedies. The number of issues raised varied per case, with some cases raising only one issue, and others raising several issues. The most common issues raised in the 907 cases filed this quarter, were placement (464 cases) and assessment (356 cases). Other issues included: designated instruction and services (269 cases), speech and language services (259 cases), occupational therapy services (147 cases), one-to-one aide services (138 cases), procedural violations (98 cases), goals and objectives (75 cases), eligibility (62 cases), extended school year services (55 cases), mental health services (42 cases), private services (31 cases), and discipline (three cases). Compensatory education was requested as a remedy in 282 cases and reimbursement was requested as a remedy in 257 cases.¹¹

Eligibility Category ¹²


The majority of cases filed this quarter involved students identified under the eligibility category of Autistic-Like Behaviors (253 cases). Other identified areas of eligibility included: Specific Learning Disability (144 cases), Speech or Language Impairment (109 cases), Other Health Impaired (107 cases), Emotional Disturbance (76 cases), Intellectual Disability¹³ (35 cases), Orthopedic Impairment (19 cases), Hearing Impairment (13 cases), Deafness (eight cases), Traumatic Brain Injury (two cases) and Deaf/Blind (two cases). The student's area of eligibility was not identified in 263 cases.¹⁴




CLOSED CASES

During this quarter, 833 cases were closed. Currently, 643 cases remain pending.¹⁵ Of the 643 cases pending, 616 are related to due process hearing requests and 27 are related to mediation-only requests. Of the 833 cases closed, 767 were related to due process hearing requests and 66 were related to mediation-only requests. Of the 833 cases closed, 802 (96 percent) were resolved in some manner without need for a due process hearing.¹⁶ For the fiscal year to date, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing.




The majority of cases closed this quarter were resolved during mediation (311 cases), followed by those that settled outside the mediation or resolution session process (288 cases), and those cases withdrawn by the filing party without explanation (139 cases). Additionally this quarter, 20 cases resolved during the resolution session, five cases were dismissed after failing to amend following a notice of insufficiency, 17 mediation-only cases were not settled at mediation, 14 cases was dismissed due to inactivity, five cases were dismissed by a motion to dismiss, and two cases were closed for other reasons. Out of the 833 cases closed this quarter, 31 were closed following a hearing and decision on the merits.




Mediations

This quarter, 470 mediations were held. The mediations were held in cases opened this quarter and in cases that were pending from prior quarters. Of the 470 mediations held this quarter, in 39 cases an additional mediation session was scheduled. Of the 470 mediations held, 415 were related to due process hearing requests, three cases involved expedited issues, six cases were related to a dual hearing request (which involve expedited and non-expedited issues) and 55 were related to mediation-only requests.

For mediation requests related to due process hearing, 310 cases reached an agreement at mediation,¹⁷ and 28 mediation-only cases reached an agreement, for a total of 338 cases resulting in an agreement.¹⁸ In the three cases involving expedited issues that went to mediation, two cases reached an agreement.¹⁹

Out of the 470 mediations held this quarter, mediation was successful in 338²⁰ cases (72 percent), with 132 mediations resulting in impasse. At the end of this quarter, 404 cases have mediations pending²¹ and 616 cases have hearings pending.²²




For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, OAH has conducted 1,598 mediations, with 1,075 resulting in an agreement and 523 resulting in impasse. The overall mediation success rate for fiscal year 2010-2011 is 67 percent. For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, 96 percent of cases have resolved without need for a due process hearing decision.



Due Process Hearings

During the fourth quarter, out of the 833 cases closed, 31 final decisions were issued. Of the 31 decisions issued, two decisions were issued within the standard 45-day timeline, 28 were issued within the 45-day timeline plus extension, and no decisions were issued late.²³ One decision was issued on a case with expedited issues and no changes of placement were ordered for this quarter.²⁴ Overall, this quarter, 100 percent of decisions were issued within the requisite timeline. For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, OAH has issued 105 decisions and 100 percent have been issued within the requisite timelines.



Based upon the issues for hearing identified by the parties, students prevailed on all issues in six hearings (19 percent) and districts prevailed on all issues in 19 hearings (61 percent). In six of the 31 decisions issued (19 percent), the issues in the decision were split between student and district, with students prevailing on 65 issues and districts prevailing on 77 issues.²⁵ For the current fiscal year, students have prevailed on all issues in 16 hearings (15 percent), districts have prevailed on all issues in 66 hearings (63 percent), and 23 cases (22 percent) resulted in a split decision of the issues. Copies of all decisions have been provided to CDE and have been posted on the OAH website.

Of the 31 decisions issued this quarter, one case involved a preschool student, 17 cases involved elementary school students, two cases involved middle school students, and 11 cases involved high school students.

On average, the due process hearings lasted three days, with students using 43 percent of the hearing time to present their cases and districts using 56 percent of hearing time for case presentation.²⁶ During case presentation, students called an average of five witnesses per case and the districts called an average of five witnesses per case.²⁷

The hearings involved multiple areas of disability. The cases involved students identified with a disability area of Other Health Impaired (nine cases), Emotional Disturbance (seven cases), Autistic-Like Behaviors (four cases), Intellectual Disability (three cases), Specific Learning Disability (three cases), Speech or Language Impairment (two cases), Multiple Disabilities (two cases), and Orthopedic Impaired (one case).

Resolution Sessions

The IDEA requires school districts to hold resolution sessions within 15 days of receipt of a student’s complaint. While there is no legal requirement to report this data to OAH, CDE requests that OAH track this information. Accordingly, OAH sends letters to school districts asking if they held a resolution session and the outcome of that session. This quarter, based on the information OAH received, 106 resolution sessions were reported as held and 128 were reported as not held. Of the 106 resolutions sessions reported as held, two cases were regarding expedited cases.²⁸

Motions

Prehearing motions and Notices of Insufficiency (NOI) comprise a substantial amount of the work completed by administrative law judges. For this quarter, 327 prehearing motions and 64 NOIs were filed by the parties and considered and ruled upon by OAH. Of the 327 prehearing motions that were ruled on by OAH, 88 were filed by students, 73 were filed by districts and 166 motions were stipulated.²⁹ Of the 64 NOIs filed, 15 were found insufficient, 15 were partially sufficient, and 34 were sufficient. Five cases were dismissed for insufficiency after failing to amend the complaint.³⁰

There were 327 prehearing motions filed this quarter. Of the 88 motions filed by students, 56 were granted, three were granted in part and 29 were denied. Of the 73 motions filed by districts, 37 were granted, five were granted in part, and 31 were denied. Of the remaining 166 stipulated motions filed by either students or districts, 157 were granted, two were granted in part and seven were denied.³¹

The prehearing motions involved a variety of issues, with the largest number involving motions to continue (186 motions).



NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS AND INTERPRETERS

During this quarter, 116 non-English-speaking students were identified through the due process hearing request forms.³² Of the 116 non-English-speaking students, 107 students spoke Spanish, four students spoke Cantonese, two students spoke Japanese, one student spoke Armenian, one student spoke Russian, and one student spoke Vietnamese. OAH received 81 requests for the assistance of an interpreter at a hearing or mediation.

STUDENTS OF COLOR


CDE has requested that OAH collect data on the number of students of color accessing the system. To facilitate this request, OAH amended its due process hearing request form to ask the parties to voluntarily provide this information. However, not all hearing requests are made using the OAH form. This quarter, 12 students reported as being a student of color and 21 students reported as not being a student of color.³³ The remaining students did not state whether they were a student of color.

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS AND APPEALS

Data on the number of appeals and appellate outcomes are collected on an ongoing basis and include all cases that OAH was notified were appealed since July 2005. This quarter, OAH received nine requests for transcripts, and was notified of two new appeals filed.³⁴

Based on correspondence with the parties and filings that have been provided to OAH, 194 cases have been appealed since July 2005. Currently, of the 194 cases that have been appealed, 40 are pending a decision from an appellate court, 44 decisions issued by OAH have been upheld, seven decisions issued by OAH have been remanded, 10 decisions issued by OAH were reversed, 38 cases settled, 50 cases were dismissed, and five cases were withdrawn by the filing party without explanation.

Due to the difficulty in identifying which cases are appealed and the appellate outcomes, parties are invited to notify OAH of any case on appeal or any outcome on appeal that is not included in Attachment C.

MEDIATION AND HEARING EVALUATIONS

OAH is required to send evaluations to all parties attending mediations and hearings. The evaluations contain a rating scale of 1 to 5, with 1 being poor/very dissatisfied and 5 being excellent/extremely satisfied. The evaluations ask the parties to evaluate the mediation, the administrative law judge and OAH in general.

This quarter, 174 mediation evaluations were returned to OAH. Evaluations were completed by parents (37 cases), legal counsel for parents (eight cases), advocates for parents (seven cases), school district representatives (58 cases), and legal counsel for districts (19 cases). In 45 cases, the evaluator did not indicate his or her role in the mediation.
