ORDER DENYING MOTION TO
ENFORCE STAY PUT ORDER

On September 10, 2012, Student's mother (Mother) filed a motion seeking an order enforcing the Office of Administrative Hearings' (OAH) August 31, 2012 order granting Student's motion for stay put (Order).¹ On September 17, 2012², District, through its attorney, filed an opposition. District's attorney persuasively argued that District administrators went on their Labor Day holiday break before District received the Order, that upon their return they acted to implement the terms of the Order, and that District implemented the Order beginning on September 10, 2012. Mother did not file a response to District's opposition or refute District's position. Therefore, because District has established that it implemented the Order, Student's motion to enforce it is moot. Student's motion is denied.
