ORDER GRANTING INITIAL JOINT
REQUEST FOR CONTINUANCE AND
SETTING PREHEARING
CONFERENCE AND DUE PROCESS
HEARING

On April 14, 2014, the parties jointly filed an initial request to continue the dates in this matter. The initial hearing date is April 30, 2014.

A due process hearing must be conducted and a decision rendered within 45 days of receipt of the due process notice unless an extension is granted for good cause. (34 C.F.R. § 300.515(a) & (c) (2006); Ed. Code, §§ 56502, subd. (f), 56505, subd. (f)(3); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 1, § 1020.) As a result, continuances are disfavored. Good cause may include the unavailability of a party, counsel, or an essential witness due to death, illness or other excusable circumstances; substitution of an attorney when the substitution is required in the interests of justice; a party's excused inability to obtain essential testimony or other material evidence despite diligent efforts; or another significant, unanticipated change in the status of the case as a result of which the case is not ready for hearing. (See Cal. Rules of Court, rule 3.1332(c).) OAH considers all relevant facts and circumstances, including the proximity of the hearing date; previous continuances or delays; the length of continuance requested; the availability of other means to address the problem giving rise to the request; prejudice to a party or witness as a result of a continuance; the impact of granting a continuance on other pending hearings; whether trial counsel is engaged in another trial; whether the parties have stipulated to a continuance; whether the interests of justice are served by the continuance; and any other relevant fact or circumstance. (See Cal. Rules of Court, rule 3.1332(d).)

OAH has reviewed the request for good cause and considered all relevant facts and circumstances. The request is:

Granted. All dates are vacated. The request is reasonable because the parties seek a continuance that is only two weeks. This matter will be set as follows:

Prehearing Conference: July 14, 2014 at 10:00 a.m.
Due Process Hearing: July 22, 23, 24, 28, 29, 2014 and continuing day to day, Monday through Thursday, as needed at the discretion of the Administrative Law Judge. The first day of hearing shall begin at 9:30 a.m.; July 23, 24, and 29 shall begin at 9 a.m., and July 28 shall begin at 1:30 p.m., unless otherwise ordered.
Please note the change in dates from parties' request.
