Name of Organization	The name of the organization is the State Fleet Petroleum Reduction Advisory Committee (Advisory Committee).	
Authority to Establish	Public Resources Code §25722.8 (a) On or before July 1, 2009, the Secretary of State and Consumer Services, in consultation with the Department of General Services and other appropriate state agencies that maintain or purchase vehicles for the state fleet, including the campuses of the California State University, shall develop and implement, and submit to the Legislature and the Governor, a plan to improve the overall state fleet's use of alternative fuels, synthetic lubricants, and fuel-efficient vehicles by reducing or displacing the consumption of petroleum products by the state fleet when compared to the 2003 consumption level based on the following schedule:	
	 (1) By January 1, 2012, a 10-percent reduction or displacement. (2) By January 1, 2020, a 20-percent reduction or displacement. (b) Beginning April 1, 2010, and annually thereafter, the Department of General Services shall provide to the Department of Finance and the appropriate legislative committees of the Legislature a progress report on meeting the goals specified in subdivision (a). The Department of General Services shall also make the progress report available on its Internet Web site. 	
Objectives	The key objectives of the Advisory Committee are to:	
	Provide the Secretary of the State and Consumer Services Agency, Legislature and Governor with a detailed blueprint on how state agencies can reduce petroleum consumption in the state fleet within the target goals set forth in PRC 25722.8 (a).	
	Provide a venue for state agencies that maintain or purchase fleet vehicles to contribute to a statewide plan to reduce the consumption of petroleum products.	
	Develop a draft plan using fresh ideas and best practices to improve the state fleet's use of alternative fuels, synthetic lubricants and fuel-efficient vehicles.	

Executive Sponsors	The Advisory Committee is sponsored by the Secretary of the State and Consumer Services Agency and the Executive Office of the Department of General Services.		
Membership	Membership on the Advisory Committee is open to state agencies that maintain or purchase fleet vehicles.		
Frequency of Meetings	The Advisory Committee will meet approximately once a month beginning in November 2008 and until a committee approved draft petroleum reduction plan is forwarded to the DGS Executive Office no later than March 1, 2009.
