In the spirit of sharing, I'm happy to report to you on the progress within Priority Funding:

Current Priority Funding Certification Period:

The recent 30-day priority funding certification filing period ended on August 9, 2012. School districts and charter schools submitted requests to be eligible to receive priority funding apportionments for projects on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans). The OPSC received valid requests for 217 projects from 103 districts, representing nearly \$534.3 million in unfunded approvals (54 percent of eligible projects). Approximately \$995.3 million of unfunded approvals for 402 projects from 141 districts were eligible to participate in this filing period. Requests will be valid until January 8, 2013.

Fund Releases for June 2012 Priority Funding Apportionments

At the June 27, 2012 meeting, the SAB approved \$637.6 million in priority funding apportionments for 196 projects in 96 school districts. As of August 17, 2012, the OPSC has received fund release requests for \$357.9 million for 139 projects, and nearly \$268.9 million has been released for 117 projects.

Districts that received a priority funding apportionment on June 27, 2012 must complete a *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) containing an original signature, and submit it to the OPSC by September 25, 2012. If the Form SAB 50-05 is not physically received at the OPSC by 5:00 PM on Tuesday, September 25, 2012, the project will be rescinded without further SAB action and will receive a new Unfunded Approval date of September 25, 2012.

Methods for Accepting School Facility Program Applications Without Authority

At the August 22, 2012 State Allocation Board (SAB) meeting, the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) staff presented options for accepting, processing, and tracking School Facility Program (SFP) new construction and modernization funding applications once bond authority is exhausted.

After careful consideration, the SAB approved the use of an SAB "acknowledged" workload list to track applications submitted beyond available bond authority. The OPSC will continue to accept applications; however, they will not be processed for final grant determination. Each application will be placed on a workload list based on date order received. On a monthly basis, the OPSC will present the workload list to the SAB for acknowledgement.

The SAB decision also requires that additional information be submitted as part of the application package. Districts will be required to submit documentation certifying that the local governing board acknowledges that there is not guarantee of state funding for submitted applications.

As the applications are not being fully processed, districts will not be receiving 15 and four-day letters for all projects submitted after bond authority has been exhausted. Applications will only be processed to the SAB as bond authority becomes available.

In order to implement the SAB's decision, OPSC will bring a regulatory update back to a future meeting. The requirements set forth by the SAB decision will be implemented once amended regulations have been approved by the SAB and the Office of Administrative Law.

Until new regulations become effective, applications received by the OPSC that exceed available bond authority will be fully processed and presented to the SAB for unfunded approvals to be placed on the Unfunded List (Lack of Authority) pursuant to SFP Regulation Section 1859.95.

Rules and Procedures Subcommittee Meeting Update

The State Allocation Board (SAB) Rules and Procedures Subcommittee (Subcommittee) met on Wednesday, August 15, 2012 and discussed Consent Special items, Structure of Recommendations to the State Allocation Board, and the formation of SAB Working Groups.

The Subcommittee reached consensus on the following items:

1. Eliminate the Special Consent category and move the Action Items that represent those types of projects/items to the Consent calendar portion of the SAB Agenda.
2. Change the structure of appeals by presenting options to the SAB rather than recommendations and that it would take six positive votes to approve a district's appeal. If the SAB takes no action, the OPSC's administrative action stands.

The Subcommittee agreed that no changes were necessary regarding the formation of SAB working groups since it is addressed in the existing [Rules and Operating Procedures of the State Allocation Board](#).

Modifications to the *Rules and Operating Procedures of the State Allocation Board* will be brought forward to the SAB at the September 19, 2012 meeting.

At its April 2012 meeting, the State Allocation Board (SAB) established the SAB Department of Defense Subcommittee (Subcommittee). The Subcommittee’s purpose was to look at funding options to assist districts that have the seven California base schools that are eligible for the first two rounds of the Department of Defense (DOD) funding program in meeting their twenty percent matching share requirement.

In 2010, the DOD assessed the condition and capacity of public schools on military bases. In California, all of the schools on bases are owned and operated by public school districts on property owned by the federal government.

The DOD performed a facilities assessment and a functional adequacy assessment at each site. Based on the findings of the physical assessment, the a priority list of the public schools on military installations with the most serious condition and/or capacity deficiencies.

California has seven schools in five districts that potentially qualify for an estimated \$200 million of the \$500 million reserved for the first two funding cycles. The majority of the districts involved are in unique situations and face funding deficiencies due to rural locations and the inability to pass local facilities bonds. As a result, the majority of the districts are seeking State assistance to meet the twenty percent matching share requirement.

The Subcommittee discussed several considerations at the June 12, 2012 Subcommittee hearing. Two recommendations would be presented to the SAB.

After consideration at the August 22, 2012 meeting, the SAB will recommend to the Legislature that future school facilities bond funds be made available specifically for schools identified as part of the DOD Public Schools on Military Installations Priority List. The following items were presented at the [August 10, 2012](#) State Allocation Board Implementation Committee (Committee) meeting:

Multipurpose Room/Gymnasium Hybrid Minimum Essential Facilities

The Committee discussed providing funding for "hybrid" facilities for districts making a "Use of Grants" request, pursuant to School Facility Program Regulation 1859.77.3. The regulation did not anticipate hybrid facilities where a combined multipurpose room/gymnasium within the same structure shared square footage.

After discussions with representatives from the California Department of Education, the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) proposed defining "multipurpose room/gymnasium hybrid" for Use of Grants requests. The proposed regulations would also, for "Use of Grants" requests, include a method of calculating the number of pupil grants a school district may request to build a multipurpose room/gymnasium hybrid facility.

Regulatory amendments will be presented at a future meeting of the State Allocation Board.

Total funds released: \$1.436 billion of \$1.439 billion — 100 percent
Total projects: 418 projects have received funds

October 2009 Bond Sale and November 2009 Commercial Paper:

Total funds released: \$504.2 million of \$510.1 million — 99 percent
Total projects: 250 projects have received funds

November 2009 Bond Sale and December 2009 Commercial Paper:

Total funds released: \$109.9 million of \$111.4 million — 99 percent
Total projects: 38 projects have received funds

March 2010 Bond Sale:

Total funds released: \$1.325.8 billion of \$1.351 billion — 98 percent



Regulatory Update

Amendments Relating to Special Day Class Modernization Grants

- Adopted at the January 25, 2012 State Allocation Board (SAB) meeting.
- Proposed regulations allow school districts to request less than the currently required 101 modernization grants for projects applying for Special Day Class pupil grants, and repeal references relating to the Small High School Program.
- Effective Date: August 16, 2012

High Performance Incentive Grants for Career Technical Education Facilities Program Projects

- Adopted at the April 25, 2012 SAB meeting.
- Allows for the application of Career Technical Education Facilities Program projects in conjunction with the High Performance Base Incentive Grants in accordance with Senate Bill 128, Chapter 622, Statutes of 2011 (Lowenthal).
- Current Status: Public comment period ends September 17, 2012.

New Timeline for the Priority Funding Process

- Adopted at the June 27, 2012 SAB meeting.
- Adjusts the priority funding filing periods and extends the length of time that priority funding requests are valid.
- Administrative review continues.

Note: Regulations become effective upon review and approval of the Office of Administrative Law.
